7. Reports

A. Managing Director

Mr. Gnadt summarized the data for July 2017. Operating expenses are \$653,095 under budget primarily due to the low cost of fuel. Token Transit has a new module for tracking individuals' origin and destination through mobile ticketing. No personal information about the rider will be transmitted so privacy is maintained. The District will be testing the new module for a reduced fee. The partners of the Illinois Terminal Expansion project are in the due diligence phase of the project as they begin to study economic impact, traffic and parking analysis.

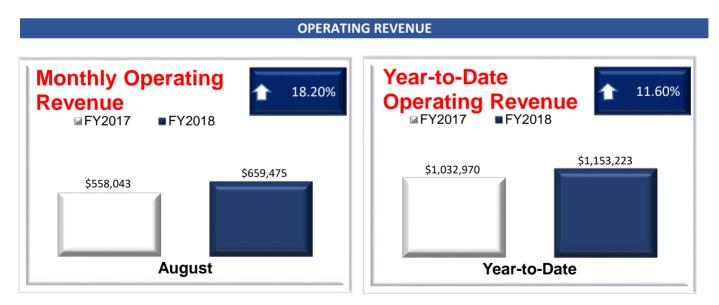

RIDERSHIP

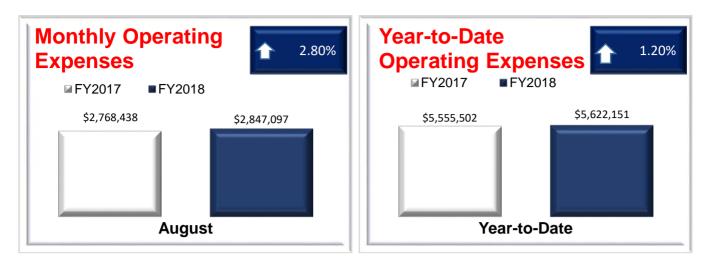


August ridership was 661,178 or 27.7% below August, 2016 (914,496). Year-to-date ridership was 1,050,576 or 21.6% below FY2017 (1,339,411).



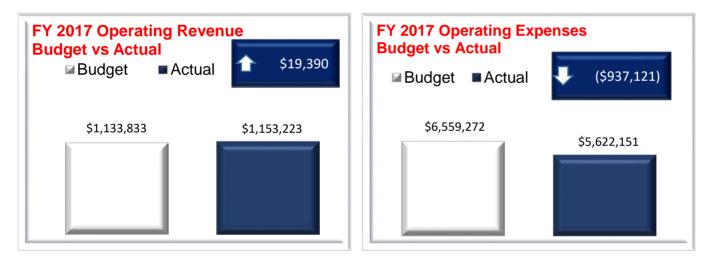
August, 2017 operating revenue was \$659,475 or 18.2% above August, 2016 (\$558,043). Year-to-date operating revenue was \$1,153,223 or 11.6% above FY2017 (\$1,032,970).

OPERATING EXPENSES



August operating expenses were \$2,847,097 or 2.80% above August, 2016 (\$2,768,438). Year-to-date operating expenses were \$5,622,151 or 1.20% above FY2017 (\$5,555,502).





Year-to-date operating revenues are \$19,390 above budget while operating expenses are \$937,121 under budget.

MANAGING DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Regarding the extensive drop in ridership for August, 2017 as compared to August, 2016 - we are now in full swing with the effects of MCORE. The vast majority of the drop is in campus-oriented trips where the impact from the construction is felt the most. With students back and classes in session, this will unfortunately be our reality for several years. Keep in mind the long-term goal and we will see improvements in the service, safety, and ridership when the project is complete. It is important to note however, that the U of I started a week later this year, so there were four fewer U of I weekdays, and one fewer Saturday/Sunday compared to last year.

Having said that, Andrew Johnson, our Chief Operating Officer, and I have discussed improving our messaging to students, faculty, and staff about navigating the campus service during the MCORE construction. We do believe that this communication can be improved and we're hopeful that the University will join us in those efforts.

The Environmental and Sustainability Management System completed a third-party audit in September. Since gaining the ISO 14001:2004 Certification, we have always had excellent audits, but this time MTD passed the audit with no findings! The system has been recommended for approval for certification to the new ISO 14001:2015 Standard. MTD's Administration & Operations Facility is now included in the scope of the certification (in addition to the already certified Maintenance Facility and Illinois Terminal).

I am extremely proud of everyone who has been preparing for this audit. This was an unusual audit since it contained three distinct prongs - 1) a surveillance audit for our existing ISO 14001:2004 certification, 2) a transition audit for moving the system to the new ISO 14001:2015 certification, and then finally 3) the scope-change audit for bringing 1101 within the system's "fenceline." This was a huge undertaking, and everyone really pulled through.

MTD was awarded a Low-No federal grant from the Federal Transit Administration. This is a competitive program for projects that put buses on the street with very low, or no-emissions. Our project is for two 60' articulated hydrogen fuel cell buses and the associated hydrogen production and fueling infrastructure. Introducing hydrogen fuel cell buses to our fleet is the ultimate expression of the District's commitment to sustainable programs. Not only are hydrogen fuel cell buses zero emissions, literally, but they also will burn zero fossil fuels once the production infrastructure has completed all of its phases.

MAJOR EFFORTS

Development Efforts

Illinois Terminal Expansion – The District has submitted a Bus & Bus Facilities grant application to the Federal Transit Administration for the project. We are also in the midst of preparing a TIGER grant application that would be applied to the ITE project.

Downtown Urbana Transit Facility – We are evaluating the potential of hiring an architectural firm to render a conceptual drawing of the project.

Route Analysis

We wait for the grant contract from IDOT. When I met with the IDOT program manager for technical assistance grants during the IPTA Fall Conference last week, he assured me that we would see it soon.

Staff continues to work on a number of projects including:

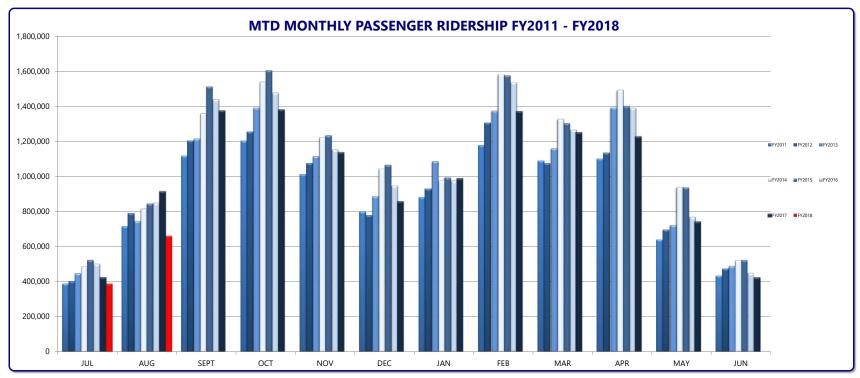
- MCORE Construction progresses on Projects 1, 2, & 3 and design work continues for Projects 4, 5, & 6.
- U of I contract negotiation discussions with U of I staff continue.
- Service development for YMCA, Carle at the Fields, and SW Champaign.

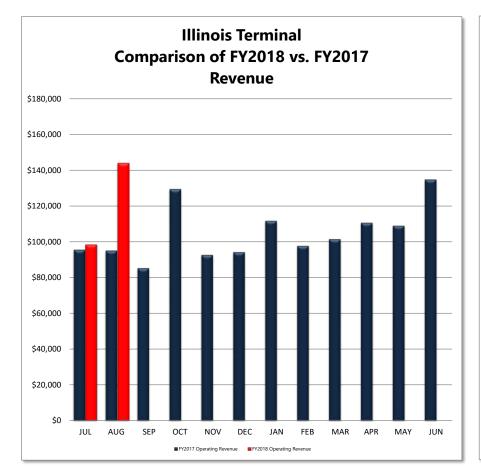

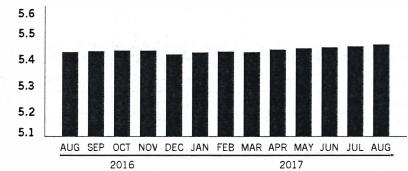

(\$) Millions



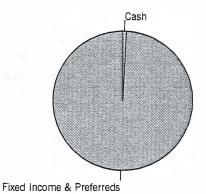

- **A.** Introduction The purpose of this item is to authorize the execution of an agreement between MTD and Urbana School District #116 for the 2017-2018 school year.
- **B.** Recommended Action Staff recommends that the Board of Trustees authorize the Managing Director to execute the agreement between the two Districts.
- **C. Prior Trustee Action** MTD has had annual agreements with District #116 since 1987.
- **D.** Summary The transportation agreement allows for eligible student access to MTD routes and tripper service. This access is provided for students of Urbana Middle School and Urbana High School only.

CHAMPAIGN-URBANA MASS TRANSIT DISTRICT 2017-2018

The following shall constitute the Transportation Agreement for the 2017-2018 school year between the Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District and the Urbana School District #116.

Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District

- 1. Transport to and from the Urbana Middle School and the Urbana High School students living in the following subdivisions or areas of the school district:
 - a) Edgewood
 - b) King School Area
 - c) Country Club Apartments
 - d) Ivanhoe Estates
 - e) Prairie School Area
 - f) Yankee Ridge Area
- 2. Transport students on school days as designated by the calendar adopted by the Board of Education for the 2017-2018 school year.
- 3. Provide the loading and unloading of students in the immediate or close proximity to the respective schools.
- 4. Keep adequate liability insurance in force with limits not less than those currently in effect on the date of execution of this Agreement. District #116 shall be listed as an additional insured on the policy and cause a current certificate evidencing such coverage to be delivered to District #116.
- 5. Work cooperatively with the Urbana School District #116 to prevent overcrowding of buses and to minimize numbers of student standees.
- 6. Work cooperatively with the Urbana School District #116 in collection of statistical data on student ridership and quality of service relating to such student ridership.
- 7. Provide a sticker for use on high school ID's to identify eligible high school riders.

Urbana School District #116

1. Provide the required bus passes to eligible middle school students.

2. Work cooperatively with MTD in providing assistance in the supervision and control of students.

Payment Procedure

- 1. For high school students, the Urbana School District will pay MTD an amount equal to total enrollment of 1,178 x 93.5 rides per student x .50 per ride = \$55,072.
- 2. For middle school students, the Urbana School District will pay MTD an amount equal to total enrollment of 942 x 98.18 rides per student x .50 per ride = \$46,243.
- 3. Additional access for high school students to provide 2 pick-ups every Wednesday at dismissal time for a cost of \$45,877 annually.
- 4. Additional access for middle school students, to provide 2 pick-ups every Wednesday at dismissal time for a cost of \$24,646 annually.
- 5. The MTD will bill the Urbana School District on a monthly basis. Based on a total cost of \$171,838 on a nine-month schedule, each monthly billing will be \$19,093.

Subject:	Approval of Bus Procurement Contract

- A. Introduction The District has received grant funding for the purchase of four 40-foot diesel-electric hybrid buses to replace four fourteen-year-old standard diesel buses.
- **B. Recommended Action**: Staff recommends authorization of the Managing Director to issue a purchase order in the amount of \$2,419,842.72 for four 40-foot diesel electric hybrid buses, pending IDOT concurrence. IDOT concurrence to award this contract has been requested.

C. Prior Trustee Action

- On September 30, 2015, the Board of Trustees provided approval to enter into a five-year bus procurement contract with New Flyer of America.
- **D. Summary:** MTD's current contract with New Flyer gives the District the ability to purchase 40-foot and 60-foot diesel-electric hybrid buses during the period 2015 to 2020. Staff request approval to exercise options on the contract by issuing a purchase order to New Flyer for four 40-foot diesel-electric hybrid buses.
- **E. Background:** When entering into the contract with New Flyer in 2015, the District operated 33 40-foot standard diesel buses purchased in 2003 with over 500,000 miles (32% of the fleet). Today, we continue to operate 14 40-foot standard diesel buses purchased in 2003 with over 500,000 miles. The federally defined useful life of a 40-foot bus is 12 years or 500,000 miles. The table below shows the purchases that have occurred since that time. The final row identifies the purchase associated with this request.

F. Alternatives – advantages/disadvantages

- 1. Authorize the Managing Director to issue a purchase order, pending IDOT concurrence. The advantage of authorization is that the District would have the ability to replace aged buses with high mileage.
- 2. Do not authorize the Managing Director to issue a purchase order. This would result in the inability to purchase buses and potentially lead to service reductions.
- **G. Community Input:** This project is included in the FY 2018-2022 TIP which was published for public comment and approved by the CUUATS Technical and Policy Committees.

H. Budget & Staffing Impacts: Staff does not anticipate staffing impacts related to this purchase order. Funding for this purchase will come from multiple external sources, no local funding will be used. We will utilize the Downstate Operating Assistance Program (DOAP) debt service mechanism. We will utilize MTD's note payable at First Bank to borrow the money and 65% of the total cost will be reimbursed by the state operating grant. The remaining 35% of the cost will be covered by a combination of an EPA Clean Diesel grant and MTD's federal appropriation, detailed below.

The purchase order to New Flyer is in the amount of \$2,419,842.72. The cost per bus is \$607,834 including the interest on the loan (\$2,431,336 total for four buses). The amount shown below is the grant funding amount, which includes the estimated interest for the loan.

Subject:	Illinois Terminal Expansion TIGER grant application - Benefit Cost Analysis Authorization

- A. Introduction The District is preparing a TIGER IX grant application for the Illinois Terminal Expansion project. As part of the application review criteria, the Department of Transportation (DOT) will consider the project's costs and benefits. We are told that DOT will, to the extent possible rely on quantitative, data-supported analysis to assess how well a project addresses this criterion, including an assessment of the project's estimated benefit-cost ratio and net quantifiable benefits based on the Benefit Cost Analysis (BCA). As applicants, we are required to delineate each of the project's expected outcomes in the form of a complete BCA to enable DOT to evaluate the project's costs for the project. Each applicant must submit a BCA that quantifies the expected benefits of the project against a no-build baseline, provides monetary estimates of the benefits' economic value, and compares the properly-discounted present values of these benefits to the project's estimated costs.
- **B. Recommended Action**: Staff recommends authorizing the Managing Director to enter into a contract with Transportation for America (T4A) for the completion of a BCA to be included in our 2017 TIGER IX grant application. The contract amount is \$16,500.
- **C. Prior Trustee Action:** This will be the first action item the Board has needed to take in preparation for the ITE project. Previous action has taken place on a staff level only.
- D. Summary: TIGER funds are to be awarded on a competitive basis for projects that will have a significant impact on the Nation, a metropolitan area, or a region. The FY 2017 Appropriations Act specifies that TIGER Discretionary Grants may not be less than \$5 million and not greater than \$25 million. MTD is applying for a TIGER IX grant to partially fund the construction for expanding Illinois Terminal. We are seeking \$15-20 million in TIGER funds.

T4A assisted the District on our application for the MCORE TIGER funds. That assistance helped us to have a cohesive, comprehensive application that resulted in the \$15.7 million award. T4A's goal statement is: "Transportation for America is an alliance of elected, business and civic leaders from communities across the country, united to ensure that states and the federal government step up to invest in smart, homegrown, locally-driven transportation solutions. These are the investments that hold the key to our future economic prosperity."

- E. Alternatives advantages/disadvantages: Authorizing the execution of a contract with T4A will allow the District to receive a completed Benefit Cost Analysis in time for the October 16, 2017 application submission deadline. T4A has demonstrated success in assisting grantees with TIGER grant applications.
- F. Budget & Staffing Impacts: \$16,500 of local District funds will be utilized for this contract. Staff impact will be primarily focused on assisting the consultants and providing data to them.
