#### 1. Call to Order

Mr. Gnadt reviewed the District's ridership and financial numbers for May 2017. Year-to-date ridership decreased by 5.23% from last year. The State budget impasse continues, and will stall MCORE

 construction if a budget resolution is not reached by June 30<sup>th</sup>. In good news, the State Comptroller released the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter reimbursement payment to CUMTD this afternoon – over \$10 million.

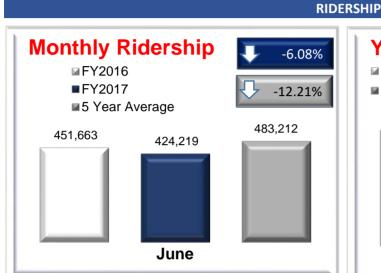

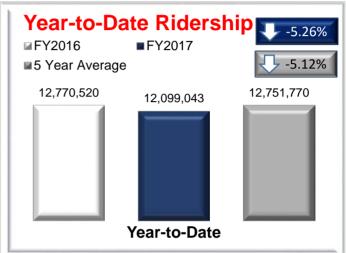

#### MTD MANAGING DIRECTOR OPERATING NOTES

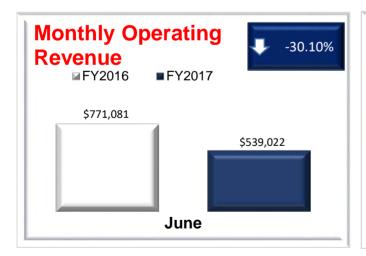

June ridership was 424,219 or 6.08% below June, 2016 (451,663). Year-to-date ridership was 12,099,043 or 5.26% below FY2016 (12,770,520).

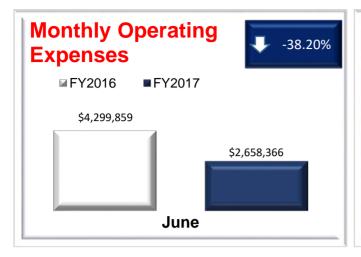
#### **OPERATING REVENUE**

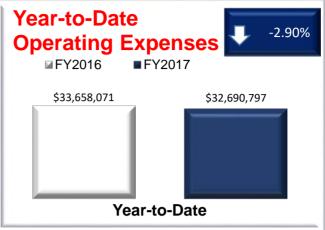




June, 2017 operating revenue was \$539,022 or 30.10% below June, 2016 (\$771,081). Year-to-date operating revenue was \$8,944,401 or 1.20% below FY2016 (\$9,055,929). This end-of-the-year discrepancy is due to a large, several hundred thousand dollar adjustment in the U of I contract revenue for FY2016. An audit had uncovered that some of the student fees had not been properly paid from the English Institute for several years. So the University made good on their obligation - but it artifically bumped up the revenue for the previous fiscal year.

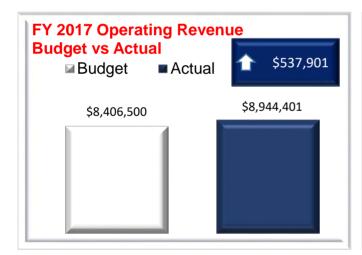
#### **OPERATING EXPENSES**

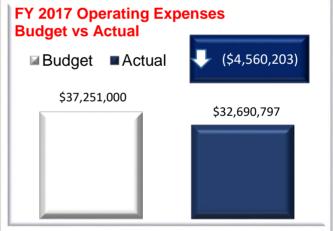




June operating expenses were \$2,658,366 or 38.20% below June, 2016 (\$4,299,859). Year-to-date operating expenses were \$32,690,797 or 2.90% below FY2016 (\$33,658,071).

#### **YEAR-TO-DATE REVENUE & EXPENSES**





Year-to-date operating revenues are \$537,901 above budget while operating expenses are \$4,560,203 under budget.

#### **MANAGING DIRECTOR'S NOTES**

I know you are aware that the legislature overrode the Governor's vetoes of the budget and implementation bills for FY2018. While no one likes to see an increase in their income taxes, the good news is that it is a step toward the State paying its bills - and that's a good thing.

There is a cut to Downstate Transit in this year's budget implementation bill. It reduces the amount of money transferred into the Downstate Public Transportation Fund by 10% without changing the actual formula. It's good that the formula didn't get changed, but the 10% cut will most likely underfund the account. However, if the Comptroller completes the FY2017 transfers that are still pending, the account should be held harmless.

A significant procedural improvement for funding Downstate Public Transit is that the money is being direct deposited into the fund, rather than having to be manually transferred. Although this frustrates the Comptroller, with the revenue increase (income tax and bonds), she should have the resources to begin to get on top of the backlog that has had her hands tied. She still has a tough job ahead of her, though.

On Tuesday, July 18 we announced publicly our partnership with Prairieview Park, LLC - Hans Grotelueschen's development firm and the City of Champaign. This partnership will produce the largest single investment into the City by expanding Illinois Terminal, building a new hotel, a new residential tower, 100,000 square feet of office space, new retail space, and parking to support the development. In addition to all that, Hans has proposed to the University of Illinois Division of Intercollegiate Athletics (DIA) a 5,000 spectator hockey and event center that would also accommodate women's basketball, women's volleyball, wrestling, men's and women's gymnastics, and a public ice skating rink.

These are all still very early concepts and much work still needs to be done. Almost no significant Architectural & Engineering work has been completed, and financial and ownership agreements haven't been worked out yet. There is a discussion item on this month's agenda as an opportunity for Trustees to receive more information from Hans, the City, and myself.



#### **MAJOR EFFORTS**

#### **Customer Service**

ISO 9001:2015/ISO 14001:2015 - The ESMS Team is preparing for upcoming review trainings scheduled for early August. The training will provide a refresher for employees on the Environmental Policy, procedures, and ongoing environmental goals. Staff will ensure that employees are competent on the basis of appropriate education, training, and experience necessary to implement the District's Environmental and Sustainability Management System. Four training sessions will be held, allowing Maintenance Department and Illinois Terminal employees on all shifts to participate.

The internal audit team conducted their annual assessment in June which included documentation review and employee interviews. There were no major findings. The system is showing continual improvement and appears to be on track to transition to the new standard.

#### **Development Efforts**

Illinois Terminal Expansion – As mentioned above, the project was finally announced publicly on Tuesday, July 18, 2017. There is a discussion item on this month's agenda for this topic.

Downtown Urbana Transit Facility – Conversations have continued with property owners of potential sites and project partners to evaluate viability.

#### **Route Analysis**

Though we have not received the contract from IDOT yet, they have informally told us that the grant has been approved. We proactively sent the RFP to their office for pre-bid concurrence so we are awaiting 1) the contract and 2) pre-bid concurrence.

#### **Ridership Study**

The District has been looking at several different app providers for different functions. One is to schedule demand response trips for services like Direct Services and SafeRides. Another is to utilize an app-based fare payment system. In discussions with one provider that we were interested in for the mobile fare system, Token Transit, it was revealed that they were getting ready to reveal a system of determining origin and destination points - THIS IS EXACTLY WHAT WE HAD BEEN WORKING ON WITH THE U OF I CS STUDENTS. The prospect of having this incorporated into the app-based fare system is very intriguing and we are pursuing it further with Token Transit.

#### **ONGOING PROJECTS**

Staff continues to work on a number of projects including:

- MCORE While construction progresses on Projects 1, 2, & 3; design work has begun for Projects 4, 5, & 6.
- Designated Stops rollout/Fall Service launch
- U of I contract negotiation discussions with U of I staff continue.
- Service development for YMCA, Carle at the Fields, and SW Champaign.

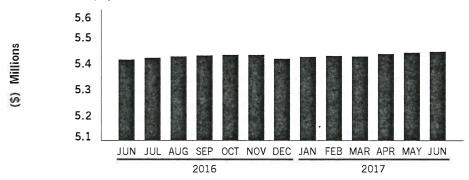

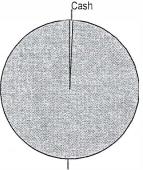

## RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION AND AMENDMENT OF DOWNSTATE OPERATING ASSISTANCE GRANT AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the provision of public transportation service is essential to the people of Illinois; and

**WHEREAS**, the Downstate Public Transportation Act (30 ILCS 740/2-1 et seq.) ("Act") authorizes the State of Illinois, acting by and through the Illinois Department of Transportation, to provide grants and to make funds available to assist in the development and operation of public transportation systems; and

**WHEREAS**, grants for said funds will impose certain obligations upon the recipient, including provision by it of the local share of funds necessary to cover costs not covered by funds provided under the Downstate Public Transportation Act.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CHAMPAIGN-URBANA MASS TRANSIT DISTRICT:

- Section 1. That the Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District enter into a Downstate Public Transportation Operating Assistance Agreement ("Agreement") with the State of Illinois and amend such Agreement, if necessary, for fiscal year 2018, in order to obtain grant assistance under the provisions of the Act.
- Section 2. That Karl P. Gnadt, Managing Director, or Andrew J. Johnson, Chief Operating Officer of the Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District are hereby authorized and directed to execute the Agreement or its amendment(s) on behalf of the Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District for such assistance for fiscal year 2018.
- Section 3. That Karl P. Gnadt, Managing Director, or Andrew J. Johnson, Chief Operating Officer, are hereby authorized to provide such information and file such documents as may be required to perform the Agreement and to request and receive the grant funding for fiscal year 2018.

Subject: Rules and Regulations of Conduct Policy for District Facilities and Vehicles

- **A.** Introduction The District is updating its Rules and Regulations Policy for facilities and vehicles. The current policy was last approved by the Board in 1999.
- **B. Recommended Action**: Staff recommends approval of this new policy.
- C. Prior Trustee Action: Approvals issued on: 01/17/1999
- **D. Summary:** The District believes that patrons and employees of the District's facilities and vehicles have the right to use the District's facilities and vehicles without being disturbed or impeded by other patron users and that patrons and employees have the right to a secure and comfortable environment. This policy standardizes the process for banning a user from a facility or from MTD vehicles while providing a formal appeal process.
- **E. Background:** The District has had a Rules and Regulations of Conduct Policy since 1999. The current policy has been primarily used at the District's facilities and has been effective at addressing the District's needs. This policy needs to be updated to be effectively applied to both District facilities and vehicles.
- **F.** Alternatives advantages/disadvantages: Approving this policy will allow the District to enforce its updated Rules and Regulations Policy for facilities and vehicles. If the Board does not approve this updated policy, the current policy will stay in effect until an updated policy is approved.
- **G. Budget & Staffing Impacts:** This policy amendment will have no additional impact to the current budget and no staffing impact.

# Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District District Facilities and District Vehicles Rules and Regulations of Conduct

The Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District ("District") has established rules and regulations of personal conduct in District facilities and District vehicles, and provided remedies for violations thereof.

The Board of Trustees of the District believes that patrons and employees of the District's facilities and vehicles have the right to use the District's facilities and vehicles without being disturbed or impeded by other patron users; that patrons and employees have the right to a secure and comfortable environment.

The Board of Trustees of the District does hereby adopt the following revised Rules and Regulations of Conduct this date of July 26, 2017:

- 1. <u>Elderly and Disabled</u>. The elderly and disabled will receive priority for designated seating on District vehicles and in District facilities;
- 2. <u>Appropriate Dress Attire</u>. All persons entering a District vehicle or District facility (except infants who are held) must be dressed appropriately, including wearing a shirt and shoes.
- 3. <u>Non-User activity & Camping</u>. Non-User activity or camping at or in District facilities or vehicles is prohibited.
- 4. <u>Prohibited Behavior</u>. No person shall:
- (a) Interfere with the operation or movement of any District vehicle or District facility;
- (b) In any manner hang onto, or attach himself or herself, in a dangerous manner, onto any exterior or interior part of a District vehicle or in a District facility at any time;
- (c) Ride a skateboard, manual scooter, roller blades, bicycle, hoverboard or engage in other dangerous physical activity on District facilities;
- (d) Knowingly throw an object at or within a District vehicle or a District facility, or at any person on a District vehicle or in any part of a District facility;
- (e) Smoke tobacco or other nicotine products (including smokeless) or any other substance, or carry any burning or smoldering substance, in any form, aboard a District vehicle or in any non-designated smoking areas of any District facility;
- (f) Spit, defecate, or urinate in or upon any District vehicle or District facility except in the designated restroom facility equipment;
- (g) Discard or deposit, other than into a refuse receptacle provided for that purpose any rubbish, trash, debris, or offensive substance in or upon a District vehicle or in a District facility;
- (h) Play tape recorders, radios, or other audio devices or musical instruments on a District vehicle or in a District facility, except if the sound produced thereby is only audible through ear phones to the person carrying the device. Any form of entertainment or organized gathering must be approved by the management of any District facility or vehicle;
- (i) Canvass to collect money or sell or distribute anything, or solicit for any purpose, on any District vehicle or in any District facility, without written authorization of the District's Managing Director or designee.

- (j) Use or possess alcohol (except in designated areas or business locations possessing a liquor license) or illegal drugs on a District vehicle or in a District facility;
- (k) Place, permit or cause to be placed any notice or advertisement upon any District vehicle, or in or on any District facility, without first obtaining written permission of the District management;
- (I) Sleep or place their feet or lie down on the seats of a District vehicle or on seating provided in any District facility;
- (m) Utter provocative, offensive, or obscene language on a District vehicle or in a District facility;
- (n) Occupy any District facility without proper identification as a user of business or services within the facility;
- (o) Engage in gang activity or wear gang related apparel in District facilities or vehicles;
- (p) Refuse to leave a District facility or vehicle when instructed by a District employee;
- (q) Bring animals that are not constrained by a pet carrier into a District facility or on a District vehicle, except for those used to aid persons with disabilities. All service animals must either fit on a passenger's lap or on the floor. Animals may not take up a seat.
- (r) Occupy space on District property with their personal property for an excessive length of time or occupy an excessive amount of space on District property as determined by management;
- (s) Exhibit any behavior that is disruptive or hinders the use of a District facility or vehicle, or endangers public safety in a District facility or vehicle, including, but not limited to, loud or boisterous behavior, verbal harassment, drunkenness, and/or running;
- (t) Fail to park motor vehicles in marked parking spaces, or park motor vehicles at marked parking spaces in excess of posted time limits or City of Champaign Ordinances (Motor vehicles parked in violation are subject to removal);
- (u) Fail to secure a bicycle at designated bicycle rack devices (Bicycles secured in unauthorized areas will be subject to removal);
- (v) Engage in any activity prohibited by State, County, or Municipal Law of Illinois while in a District facility or vehicle;
- (w) Activate the "Emergency Exit" or alarm device of a District vehicle or at a District facility in the absence of an emergency;
- (x) Mutilate, deface, or destroy any District property, sign, notice or advertisement posted by the District at a District facility or on any District vehicle;
- (y) Steal personal property or District property from patrons or employees in a District facility or vehicle;
- (z) Assault, physically harass, or engage in any unwanted touching of any person;
- (aa) Knowingly possess a weapon, as determined by a District employee, at or within a District vehicle or a District facility outside of a legal carry-case, except that of a peace officer in the course of duty;
- (ab) Fight in a District facility or vehicle;
- (ac) Knowingly discharge a weapon, as determined by a District employee, at or within a District vehicle or a District facility, except that of a peace officer in the course of duty.
- \*\* The Prohibited Behavior set forth in this section is indicative of possible violations and is not meant to be exhaustive of possible violations of District policy or rules or regulations.

### 5. Removal, Prosecution & Exclusion

- (a) Any person who engages in Prohibited Behavior identified above in Section 4 may be subject to immediate removal from the District facility or vehicle, and arrest.
- (b) In addition to immediate removal under Section 5(a), any person who engages in Prohibited Behavior

identified above in Section 4(a) through (u) may be subject to exclusion from any and all District facilities and vehicles for a period of time not less than one (1) month, but not greater than six (6) consecutive months.

- (c) In addition to immediate removal under Section 5(a), any person who engages in Prohibited Behavior identified above in Section 4(v) through (aa) may be subject to exclusion from any and all District facilities and vehicles for a period of time not less than six (6) consecutive months, but not greater than twelve (12) consecutive months.
- (d) In addition to immediate removal under Section 5(a), any person who engages in Prohibited Behavior identified above in Section 4(ab) through (ac) may be subject to exclusion from any and all District facilities and vehicles for a period of time not less than twelve (12) consecutive months, and up to and including indefinite and permanent exclusion.
- (e) Notwithstanding the above in Sections 5(b)-(d), the duration of an exclusion can be reduced or enhanced depending upon the specific prohibited behavior(s) and circumstances of an occurrence or set of occurrences, whether the person has engaged in multiple prohibited behaviors at a time, whether the person has repeatedly engaged in prohibited behavior(s) over a period of time, and/or whether the person has previously been excluded from District facilities or vehicles.
- (f) A person excluded under Section 5(b)-(d) may not enter or remain upon any District facility or vehicle subject to the exclusion during the period of exclusion. An excluded person who enters or remains upon any District facility or vehicle facility from which the person has been excluded is a trespasser and may be subject to arrest and prosecution. In addition, failure to abide by an exclusion may constitute a further violation of these rules and regulations for which the duration of exclusion may be extended.
- (g) The District's Chief Operating Officer and/or Chief Administrative Officer (or District employee of equivalent position of authority) may issue a written exclusion to a person after sufficient time to review the specific circumstances of an occurrence or set of occurrences. A written exclusion notice signed by the issuing District representative shall be given to a person excluded from all or part of District facilities or vehicles. The exclusion notice shall specify the reason(s) for exclusion, places and duration of exclusion, and the consequences for failure to comply with the notice. Exclusion will commence immediately upon delivery of the exclusion notice to the excluded person.
- (h) Not later than ten (10) calendar days after commencement of the exclusion, an excluded person may appeal, in writing, to the District's Managing Director, or designee, for full review of the exclusion and may petition the Managing Director, or designee, to rescind the exclusion, alter the places of exclusion, or reduce the duration of exclusion. An appeal shall contain a copy of the exclusion notice, a request for review of the exclusion, a written statement setting forth the reason(s) that the exclusion is invalid, improper, or otherwise should be rescinded, and any other supporting materials or documents. The Managing Director, or designee, shall render a decision on the appeal not later than ten (10) calendar days after the Managing Director's receipt of the written appeal.
- (i) At any time during an exclusion, an excluded person may petition, in writing, to the Managing Director, or designee, for a temporary waiver of the exclusion.

RE: Review of Minutes of Closed Sessions

The Open Meetings Act requires that the minutes of closed sessions be reviewed periodically to determine if "the need for confidentiality still exists." The last review by the Board was January 13, 2017. The attachment lists all closed session minutes that have not been released together with my recommendation.

Most of those minutes recommended to remain confidential out of privacy concerns because they relate to worker's compensation cases that are less than 20 years old.

The statutes permit the destruction of verbatim recordings of closed sessions if they are not less than 18 months old and the written minutes have been approved. Attached is a list of those closed meetings that meet that test and should be destroyed. (Attachment 3)

I attach a suggested motion for the Board's action.
