7. Reports

A. Managing Director

In comparing statistics, Mr. Gnadt noted that February 2019 ridership is very close to the same number as last year. MCORE construction is in full swing. A major reroute is in effect due to the closure of Wright Street to southbound traffic between Green Street and Chalmers – traffic can still use the northbound lanes. Staff has created a special page on MTD's website to detail the reroutes for the community – https://mtd.org/maps-and-schedules/reroutes/. A direct result of MCORE improvements for the District will be better schedule adherence for our buses and improved service for our riders. This effect can already be seen on the Green route in its improved on-time performance.

MTD celebrated National Transit Driver Appreciation Day on March 18th, and the public responded with an outpouring of positive comments for our Operators on MTD's social media. On March 16th, MTD Launched SafeRides Connect, an app-based scheduling program for late night service on campus. It has gone well with some small glitches. Our planners are working closely with Routematch technology support to work out the kinks.

8. Action Items

A. Cotter Consulting, Inc. Agreement

Cotter Consulting, Inc. offers expertise on the complex financial negotiations that are on-going with The Yards project. This firm or a similar one will represent the interests of the District. MTD will be using local funds for this expenditure.

B. <u>Update of Bank Signature Cards</u>

With Amy Snyder's promotion to Chief of Staff, the District's bank resolutions and signature cards will be updated to include Ms. Snyder as an authorized signer. Mr. Gnadt as Managing Director and Brenda Eilbracht as Chief Administrative Officer will remain as signers on all accounts.

The District has two lines of credit with First Mid Bank & Trust that mature on April 27, 2019. The District would like to extend the lines of credit to coincide with the fiscal year end on June 30, 2019. Additionally, the Chief of Staff and Finance Director will now be authorized to borrow on the lines. The current officers with borrowing authority include the Managing Director, Chief Administrative Officer and Comptroller.

MOTION by Ms. Chaplan to authorize the Managing Director to extend the maturity date of the First Mid Bank & Trust lines of credit to 6/30/2019 and authorize the Chief of Staff and the Finance Director as additional District officers who can borrow on the lines of credit; seconded by Mr. Barnes. 

April, 2019




Ridership was down 2.4% from last March or 27,405 rides. The calendar this year had one fewer weekday and one more Sunday. The average difference between a UI weekday and UI Sunday is about 40,000 rides. So, if the calendars were equal it appears as though there would have been closer to a 1% increase in ridership. Otherwise, it was a slightly colder month but the precipitation and gas prices were comparable.

Spring Break brought on construction season with several road closures and the Bradley Avenue bridge soon followed. The MCORE reroute is top of mind and it began March 26th.

A look at the fare types isn't too surprising but there was a nice bump in the Veteran Pass usage (+46.5%) and the bump in monthly pass usage (8.9%) can be partially explained by the drop in annual pass usage (-11.5%).

As discussed before, the biggest factor in the ridership drop, especially with the student rides and UI rides, is the calendar.


OPERATING REVENUE






March, 2019 operating revenue was 2.3% below March, 2018, and year-to-date operating revenue was 2.4% below FY2018.


Monthly Operating Expenses FY2018 FY2019 \$3,114,048 \$2,971,048 March March

Year-to-date operating revenues are \$540,487 above budget while operating expenses are \$3,394,577 under budget.

MANAGING DIRECTOR'S NOTES

- * Our ISO management system, MTD2071 will be audited against the international standards in the first week of May. In preparation of the audit, our core team of staff members has completed an internal self-audit and a management review. The management review was a report to top management Karl Gnadt (CEO) and Brenda Eilbracht (CAO). It also included Trustees Margaret Chaplan (Service Delivery Committee Chair) and Jim Faron (Facilities Committee Chair). A helpful and positive discussion followed the presentation which ended with agreement that the system is working and valuable.
- * SafeRides Connect launched over Spring Break last month. I would not attribute the 9.2% increase in ridership this month to that service change. Comparing the dates, there was approximately a 3.5% decrease in ridership as the system was reintroduced. There have been, and continue to be, some technical issues and operational challenges that we continue to work on. However, there are signs that the issues are getting fewer, less impactful, and ridership is trending upward. There are more than 1,300 registered users which seems like a lot, but we never before had information about how many unique individuals use SafeRides. We will continue to get useable information and will work on ways of using and reporting on it.

MAJOR EFFORTS

Development Efforts

The Yards/Illinois Terminal Expansion – The City of Champaign and the MTD are both working on the financial side of the development agreements with the developers. We are also simultaneously gearing up for the next round of BUILD and 5339 Bus & Bus Facilites grant applications. It looks like the Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for the BUILD program will be published mid-April. Still no word on when the 5339 NOFO will be published.

A study session with the City of Champaign City Council is pending to launch the next step of the project. This will likely be a specific "ask" from the developer for the City to invest in the project.

ONGOING PROJECTS

Staff continues to work on:


- MCORE Construction and reroutes have begun again.
- Preparation of RFPs to bid out work for the H2 Fuel Cell Project. The RFPs are being submitted to IDOT for their concurrence and then we will begin soliciting proposals.



The below chart displays the most recent thirteen months of Market Value.



Subject: Approval of Operations and Administration Facility Boiler Replacement Contract

- **A. Introduction:** The District is utilizing Debt Service funds from the FY 2019 Downstate Operating Assistance Program to replace a sixteen-year-old boiler at the Operations and Administration Facility. The existing boiler is failing, and installation of two new high efficiency boilers will improve overall building performance and reduce gas usage.
- **B. Recommended Action**: Staff recommends authorization of the Managing Director to enter into a contract with lowest responsive and responsible bidder.
- C. Prior Trustee Action: None
- **D. Summary:** Bids for this project will be opened on Monday, April 22, 2019, at 2pm. A bid tabulation and recommendation from the project engineer will be provided following the bid opening.
- **E. Background:** The current boiler serving the District's Operations & Administration Facility is 16 years old and not within a state of good repair. The equipment is unreliable and in poor condition. A cracked heat exchanger is causing the system to run at 50% capacity. The new boiler will decrease natural gas consumption, have redundancy capabilities, and have a useful life of 20 years.
- **F. Budget & Staffing Impacts:** This project will be funded with 65% state funds through the Illinois Downstate Operating Assistance Program (DOAP) and 35% local funds.
