#### 8. Reports

A. Managing Director

May statistics show a 5.7% decrease in ridership from last year as MCORE continues to impact ridership negatively. Staff will be opening hydrogen/storage/fueling station proposals in mid-July and hope to have the contract for approval at the August Board meeting. The first grant application for The Yards Project, 5339 Bus & Bus Facilities, was submitted and the BUILD grant application is due July 15<sup>th</sup>.

Monthly operating expenses increased 34% from FY2018 due to an accounting adjustment last year concerning MTD's participation in MCORE. It was initially recorded as a capital asset but should be an operating expense. Mr. Gnadt noted that the decrease in annual passes was primarily due to the introduction of free veterans' passes.

11		C. <u>Developmental Services Center (DSC) Contract</u>
12		This is an annual recurring contract with Developmental Services Center to provide ADA transportation
13		for their clients within the District boundaries. The District is required by law to insure transportation
14		for persons with mobility-limiting disabilities. MTD contracts this service to DSC as they can provide a
15		specialized level of transportation and care services for their clients. The amount of the contract is
16		\$516,733.53.

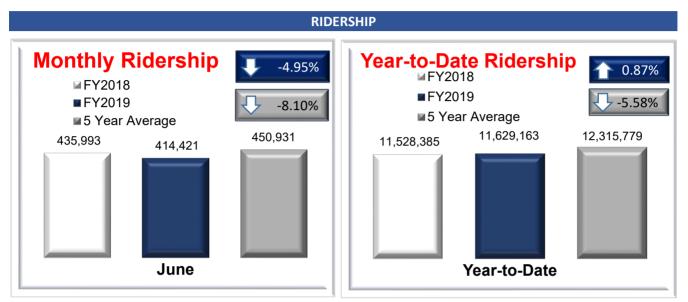

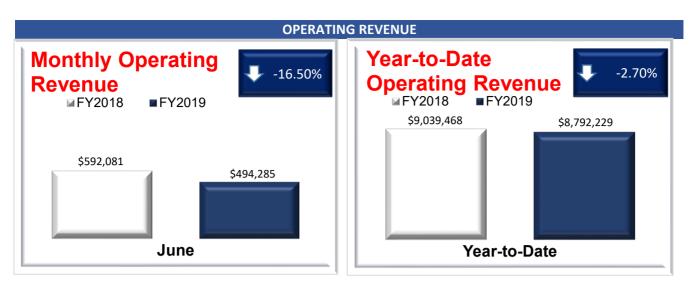
#### MTD MANAGING DIRECTOR OPERATING NOTES

July, 2019

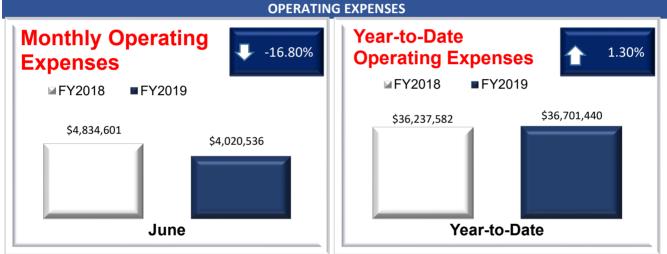


Ridership was down 5% from last June or 21,478 rides. This is in part due to the calendar having one fewer weekday and one more Sunday this year, which would account for about 13,000 rides. An adjusted comparison would be more like a reduction of about 2%. Other environmental factors include a cooler June (-4 degrees), drier (-2.43") and lower gas price (-\$0.26) compared to last year.

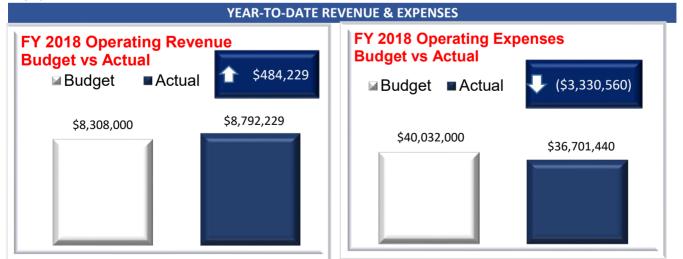
It was close as to whether we would have a ridership increase for FY2019 over FY2018, but we did by 0.9% or 100,778 rides.



June, 2019 operating revenue was 16.5% below June, 2018, and year-to-date operating revenue was 2.7% below FY2018. What appears to be a drop in the monthly revenue was caused by a combination of a one-time University of Illinois payment last year for a student transportation fee adjustment and the accrual allocation.



June operating expenses were 16.8% below June, 2018. Year-to-date operating expenses were 1.30% above FY2018. Paid Time Off (PTO) calculations have not been posted yet and are not included in this fiscal year's report. GASB 68 estimates also have not yet been posted and year-end adjustments won't be made until next month.



Year-to-date operating revenues are \$484,229 above budget while operating expenses are \$3,330,560 under budget.

#### MANAGING DIRECTOR'S NOTES

\* We received four proposals for our Hydrogen production/storage/fueling station on July 12. The evaluation team has already begun to analyze and evaluate the proposals. We had presentations by all four proposers on July 25. We expect to bring the results to you for the August Board Meeting.

\* The BUILD grant application was submitted on Monday, July 15. This is the second (and final) grant application submittal for The Yards this year. Announcements for both grants are expected this fall.

\*We have made significant progress on the negotiations for both the Intergovernmental Agreement with the City and the Developer Agreement with Core Hockey, LLC. We hope to have drafts to bring to you for the August or September Board Meeting.

\* Our Planners have provided the consultants for the Route Analysis with the data needed to begin the analysis. The consultants will begin conducting outreach activities, including participation in MTD's booth at the Urbana Sweetcorn Festival and UI Quad Day. We are working to schedule the first meeting with the Technical Advisory Committee for late-August.

\* MTD was proud to partner with the United Way of Champaign County on July 26 for a community Day of Action, an annual event that mobilizes the caring power of volunteers to make a meaningful impact in more than 400 communities around the world. They collected items off their Day of Action Wish List and used an MTD bus as a collection vehicle.

\* Over the past month, the Technology Services department has worked with our CAD/AVL vendor to deploy and test the on-board cellular pilot project. The deployment was successful and cellular data communications are up and running on five vehicles, including the two new '19 series buses. The pilot will run for several months while we continue to test and gather feedback. Pending a successful pilot, we will begin rolling out cellular data communication to all vehicles in the '16 fleet and newer.

#### MAJOR EFFORTS

#### **Development Efforts**

The Yards/Illinois Terminal Expansion – We have made significant and positive progress in our negotiations with both the City of Champaign (on the Intergovernmental Agreement) and the developer (on the Development Agreement). Nothing specific to share at this stage, but negotiations continue.

#### **ONGOING PROJECTS**

Staff continues to work on:

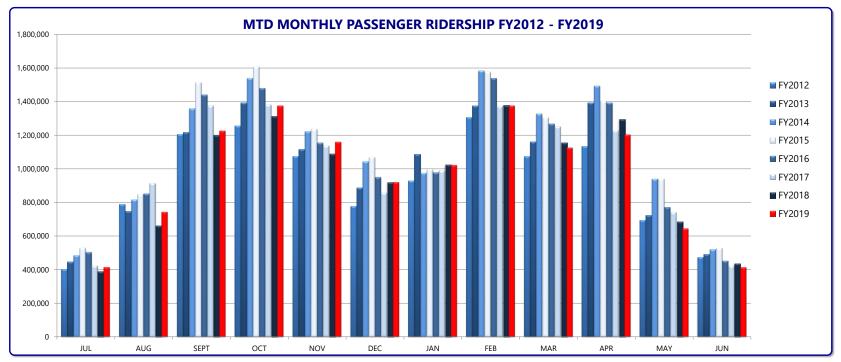
MCORE – Construction and reroutes are ongoing. Wright St. remains completely closed south of Green St.
The facility modification RFP for the Hydrogen (H2) project has been approved by IDOT and should be released by the end of July.

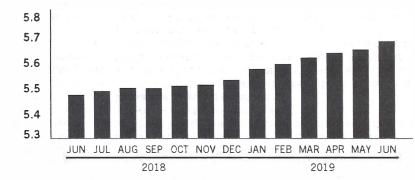

The below chart displays the most recent thirteen months of Market Value.



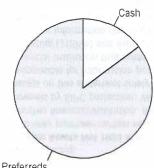

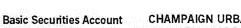

RE: Review of Minutes of Closed Sessions

The Open Meetings Act requires that the minutes of closed sessions be reviewed periodically to determine if "the need for confidentiality still exists." The last review by the Board was January 22, 2019. The attachment lists all closed session minutes that have not been released together with my recommendation.

Most of those minutes recommended to remain confidential are due to privacy concerns from past worker's compensation cases involving current MTD employees.

The statutes permit the destruction of verbatim recordings of closed sessions if they are not less than 18 months old and the written minutes have been approved. Attached is a list of those closed meetings that meet that test and should be destroyed. (Attachment 3)
