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#### 5. Approval of Minutes

A. Regular Board Meeting – August 28, 2019 – Open Session

#### 7. Reports

A. Chief of Staff

Ridership decreased 4.8% from August of last year. The decline is mostly attributable to MCORE reroutes on Wright Street due to construction. Staff has been busy with several outreach events in the summer months that generate good will and community connections.

Mr. Cho entered the meeting.

MTD staff attended Congressman Rodney Davis' Transportation Policy Summit in August to discuss the reauthorization of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act. Congressman Davis noted the need for funding diversification instead of primarily relying on revenue from the federal fuel tax. He also stated that public transit funding is vital to alleviating congestion.

#### 8. Action Item

A. Urbana School District #116 Transportation Agreement 2019-2020

This annual Agreement between MTD and Urbana School District #116 provides transportation for Urbana Middle School and High School students. The partnership with MTD and the Urbana School District has been in place since 1987.

**MOTION** by Mr. Hannon to authorize the Managing Director to execute the Transportation Agreement between MTD and Urbana School District #116 for the 2019-2020 school year; seconded by Ms. Chaplan. Upon vote, the **MOTION CARRIED** unanimously.

B. Appointment of Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund (IMRF) Authorized Agent for MTD

MTD is required to have an authorized Agent administer IMRF functions on behalf of MTD employees per the Illinois Pension Code (40 ILCS 5/7-135).

**MOTION** by Mr. Barnes to authorize Amy Snyder, Chief of Staff, as the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund Authorized Agent for MTD; seconded by Mr. Hannon. Upon vote, the **MOTION CARRIED** unanimously.

C. Update Bank and Investment Signature Cards

Due to recent staff restructuring, the Managing Director, Chief of Staff, and Chief Operating Officer will be the authorized signers on all Busey Bank, Commerce Bank, Prospect Bank, First Mid Bank & Trust, and Morgan Stanley account resolutions and signature cards.

1 2		<b>MOTION</b> by Mr. Hannon to authorize the update of all MTD bank and investments accounts with the Managing Director, Chief of Staff, and Chief Operating Officer as the authorized signatories; seconded

5		D. <u>Bus Procurement Purchase Order</u>
6		This is the final bus order under MTD's 5-year procurement contract with New Flyer. Five 40-foot
7		diesel electric hybrid buses and six 60-foot diesel electric hybrid buses will be replacing current
8		standard diesel buses that are well beyond their useful life per FTA guidelines. The total cost for these
9		11 new buses is \$9,705,722.77 which will be funded by 65% state and 35% federal money. The
10		anticipated delivery will occur in May 2020.
11		
12		MOTION by Ms. Chaplan to authorize the Managing Director to issue a purchase order in the amount
13		of \$9,705,722.77 for five 40-foot diesel electric hybrid buses and six 60-foot diesel electric hybrid
14		buses, pending IDOT concurrence; seconded by Ms. Bauer. Upon vote, the MOTION CARRIED
15		unanimously.

17		E. <u>Advertising Services Contract</u>
18		MTD released a Request for Proposal (RFP) for advertising services to include ad space on MTD's bus
19		fleet and paratransit vans, passenger information kiosks, and the annual Maps & Schedules book. The
20		evaluation team recommended Mesmerize for a period of three years, with the option to extend for
21		two additional years. Mesmerize offered a minimum guarantee of \$400,000 for the first year or a
22		52.5% share, whichever is greater. The District decided not to move forward with audio advertising
23		on the buses. Autumn Soliman, Marketing Manager will be the project manager for this contract.

26		a period of three years, with the option to extend for two additional years; seconded by Mr. Hannon.

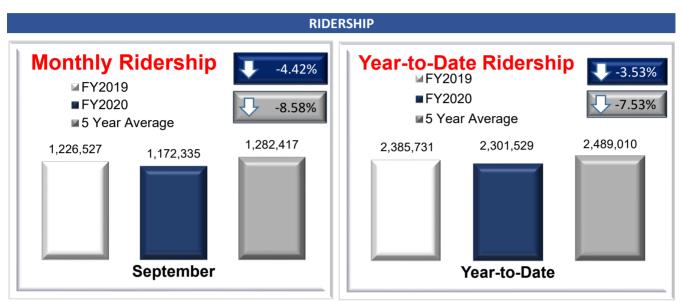

### MTD MANAGING DIRECTOR OPERATING NOTES

October, 2019

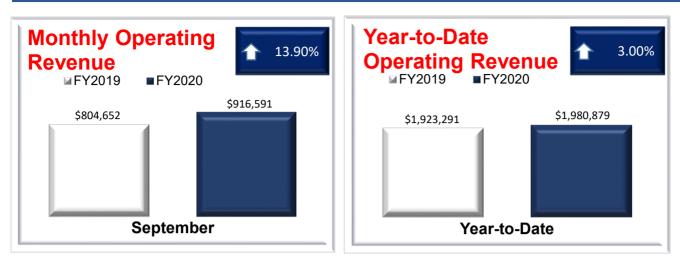


Ridership was down this September by 4.4% from last September. There was one more weekday and one fewer Saturday so if the calendars were the same from year to year we would be down by another 28,000 (approximately) rides or it may be more like -6.7%. The average temperature was down 1 degree at 71 vs 72 last year with less rain (3.1" vs . 4.7") and gas being down at \$2.52 versus \$2.74 last year. We are down 3.5% for the Fiscal year.

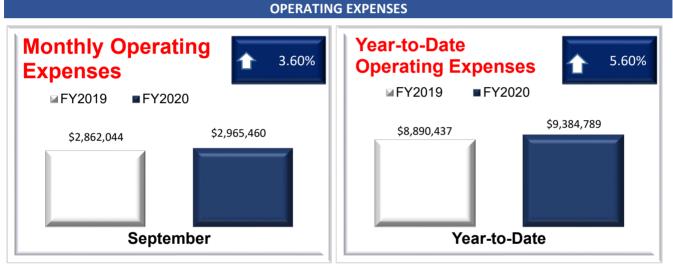
MCORE is progressing with new pavement going in on Wright Street in the northbound lane. For most of the month, we were rerouting in both directions off of Wright Street. This has had a <u>dramatic</u> impact on ridership and schedule adherence. However on September 24th, we were able to update the reroutes so that we are able to use Wright Street northbound, which allowed many of the routes to go back to regular route for one of their directions. There have been several other reroutes, including Bradley Avenue, Market Street, and one where Green Street was closed between Wright and Sixth for ten days. This has been a very difficult month and we should commend our Operators, Supervisors, and Dispatchers for handling this very well.

A look at the Route Performance Report shows where the ridership impact has been. Primarily the weekday daytime campus routes have taken the largest hit, dropping about 22 rides per hour on average. The rest of the Route Performance groups also drop, but not as significantly. The overall average passenger per revenue hour for this September was 51.14 vs 59.13 last year. There are a few noteworthy differences in the ridership by route, including the Illini and Silver routes, which have been rerouted to Fourth Street, instead of going through the Transit Plaza. Those were down 21.8% and 34.4%, respectively. Some of those losses may have been picked up by the Teal route, which was up 28.2%. And perhaps unrelated to MCORE at all, ridership on the Navy was up 32% from last year. The change we made to the routing in West Champaign has helped improve the schedule adherence of this route since last year which may have helped the ridership by being more consistently on time.

#### **OPERATING REVENUE**

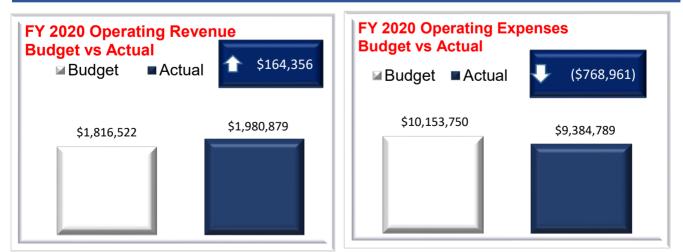


September, 2019 operating revenue was 13.9% above September, 2018, and year-to-date operating revenue was 3.0% above FY2019.



September operating expenses were 3.6% above September, 2018. Year-to-date operating expenses were 5.6% above FY2019.

#### YEAR-TO-DATE REVENUE & EXPENSES



Year-to-date operating revenues are \$164,356 above budget while operating expenses are \$768,961 under budget.

#### MANAGING DIRECTOR'S NOTES

\* Evan Alvarez, Planning & Outreach Coordinator was promoted to Special Services Manager starting October 14. You'll recall that Drew Bargmann was promoted from that position into Customer Service Director. Evan feels a particular empathy for MTD's Special Services operations, and that, combined with his in-depth knowledge of planning will make for a compelling future for our ADA service and C-CARTS.

\* The West Connect launch has been disappointing. There was a fundamental misunderstanding on the app vendor's part on how our service should operate. As a result, the app hasn't been working well. The app does give results, but none that anyone would reasonably take. We have been dispatching that service via phone calls for now. Nevertheless, the vendor is endeavoring to be a good partner in this and has worked hard to improve their understanding of the service. We do still hope to have a new version of the app working sometime this Fall.

\* CityLab has published an article that developed a Metro Car-Free Index based on data from the 2013-2017 American Community Survey (ACS). Champaign-Urbana tops the index NATIONWIDE, besting San Francisco, Boston, and New York. We wouldn't be on the list at all, much less at the top, if not for the great services that MTD provides to the community!

\* We have received concurrences from IDOT on the purchase orders for the five 40ft hybrid and six 60ft hybrid buses that were Board approved last month. Anticipated delivery is May of 2020. These vehicles will replace our final five 2003 standard diesel and six of the 2001 standard diesel buses.

\* On Monday, October 21 MTD hosted our first ever "open interview" event at Illinois Terminal. We had over twenty in attendance and received a handful of potential new operators for fixed-route, C-CARTS, and ADA Paratransit service. We also had a few drop by for Maintenance positions, and our Employee Service Specialist was particularly excited about an applicant who explicitly asked for evening service work! This event allowed us to talk applicants through available openings and encourage them to apply for those that were the best fit for their needs.

#### **MAJOR EFFORTS**

#### **Development Efforts**

The Yards/Illinois Terminal Expansion – Significant progress has been made with discussions on the development agreement and intergovernmental agreement. A separate agreement with the developer for A&E work is also in development. Additionally, National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) work is underway.

#### **ONGOING PROJECTS**

Staff continues to work on:

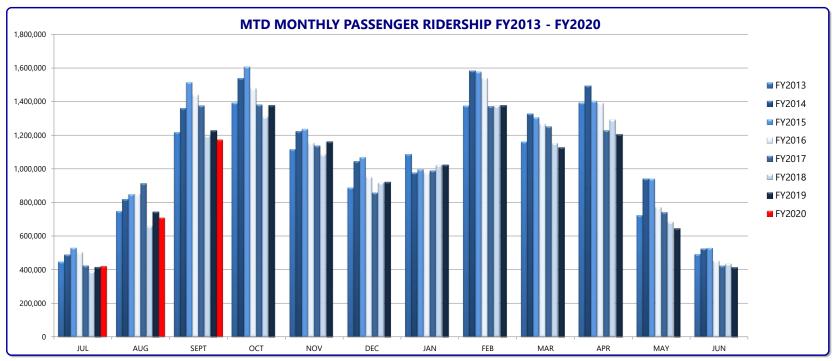
- MCORE – As mentioned above, northbound traffic on Wright Street has been restored. Southbound traffic remains rerouted. If the schedule is maintained, two-way traffic will begin by December.

- The maintenance facility modification proposal opening for the Hydrogen (H2) project was October 17. We received one bid. Due to an inconsistency in one of the required-subcontractor's information to the prime contractors, we have decided to re-bid the project. We expect to complete the re-bid process in time for a recommendation to be presented at the November/December Board meeting.

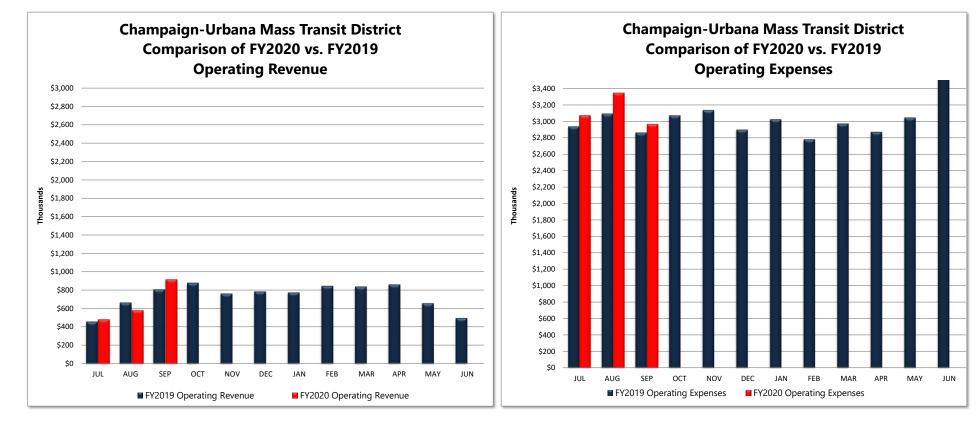

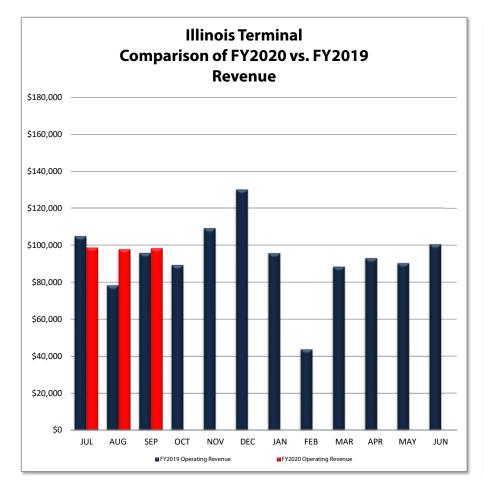

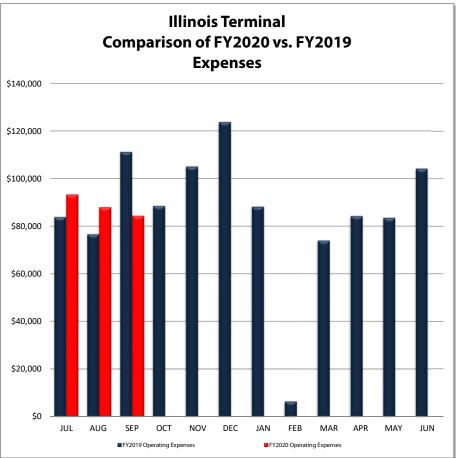

- A. Introduction Resolution setting the Levy amount for the District in Revenue Year 2019 to be paid in Calendar year 2020.
- **B.** Recommended Action Staff recommends approval of the attached Resolution setting the Levy for the above referenced year.
- C. Prior Trustee Action The Board must pass a Resolution setting the Levy each October and then pass the Levy Ordinance in the following December. Failure to do so means the Levy would revert to \$0 and due to the Property Tax Extension Limitation Law (PTELL, or commonly referred to as Tax Caps) the District would be unable to recapture the Levy.
- **D.** Summary –The new valuations that are, or might be, available are primarily made up of the properties that belong to OSF Hospital and Carle Foundation Hospital. The parcels may or may not come onto the tax rolls it is dependent upon how and when the court case winds its way through its current process.

It is important to note that this percentage does NOT represent the increase to the homeowner's or business' property tax bill. It is meant to create "room" in the levy to accommodate the new valuations. If the hospital parcels are not added to the tax rolls, then there will be no impact to the levy. For example, last year's levy was set at 21.69%, but actually only was 1.9% due to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and the fact that the hospital lawsuits were not resolved.

**E. Community Input** – A public hearing will be held prior to the adoption of the Levy Ordinance, which will be taken up by the Board at the December 11, 2019 meeting.

#### RESOLUTION No. 2019-2

#### A RESOLUTION DETERMINING THE AMOUNT OF MONEY NECESSARY TO BE RAISED BY THE TAX LEVY

WHEREAS, an Act to provide procedures for public notice and hearing on tax and levy increases, approved and effective July 29, 1981, and known and cited as "The Truth in Taxation Act" (35 ILCS 200/18-55 et.seq.) (the "Act") requires taxing districts, including the Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District, to disclose by publication and hold a public hearing on their intention to adopt an aggregate levy in amounts more than 105% of the property taxes extended or estimated to be extended upon the levy of the preceding year; and

WHEREAS, Section 200/18-60 of the Act requires the corporate authority of each taxing district, not less than twenty (20) days prior to the adoption of its aggregate levy ("Levy"), to determine the amounts of money, exclusive of any portion of that Levy attributable to the cost of conducting any election required by the general election law ("Election Costs"), estimated to be necessary to be raised by taxation for that year upon the taxable property in its district; and

WHEREAS, if the estimate of the corporate authority required to be made as provided in Section 200/18-60 of the Act is more than 105% of the amount extended or estimated to be extended upon the levy of the preceding year, exclusive of the Election Costs, Section 200/18-70 of the Act requires the corporate authority to give public notice of and hold a public hearing on its intent to adopt a levy which is more than 105% of the extensions, exclusive of Election Costs, for the preceding year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CHAMPAIGN-URBANA MASS TRANSIT DISTRICT as follows:

- <u>Section 1.</u> That the Board of Trustees of the Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District hereby finds and determines as follows:
  - a) That the amounts of money, exclusive of Election Costs, estimated and proposed to be raised by the Levy for the current year upon the taxable property in the Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District is \$10,614,433.

- b) That the aggregate amount of property taxes for the Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District, extended or estimated to be extended upon the levy of the preceding year; exclusive of Election Costs, was \$8,851,768.
- c) That the increase of the amount estimated and proposed for the current year Levy over the amounts extended or estimated to be extended for the preceding year is \$1,762,665 which is a 19.91% increase over the amount extended upon the levy of the preceding year (exclusive of election costs).

<u>Section 2.</u> That because the amounts of money, exclusive of any portion of the current year Levy attributable to the costs of conducting an election required by the General Election Law, estimated to be necessary to be raised by taxation for the current year upon the taxable property in this district is more than 105% of the amount extended upon the Levy of the preceding year, exclusive of Election Costs, prior to the adoption of a Levy Ordinance, a public hearing is necessary to comply with the Truth in Taxation Act.

This Resolution is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "Ayes" and "Nays" being called, of a majority of the members of the Board of Trustees of the Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District at a duly called regular meeting of the said Board of Trustees on the 30<sup>st</sup> day of October, 2019.
