#### 7. UIUC Ridership Study Presentation

Bumsoo Lee, Associate Professor, Department of Urban & Regional Planning, presented the University of Illinois Transit Ridership Study findings. Nearly all the ridership decline since 2005 occurred at off-campus stops. To improve ridership, Professor Lee suggested simplifying the bus system with straighter routes and focusing on high demand areas. More faculty and staff may be influenced to use transit by raising parking rates on campus.

#### 8. Reports

#### A. Managing Director

Mr. Gnadt reviewed June statistics. Ridership was down 51.5% as compared to June 2019 due to the pandemic. The final stretch of MCORE should wrap up in 2021. At this final phase, all federal money has been spent, and local money is being used. Year-end expenses and revenues will change as annual adjustments have not yet been made to close out the fiscal year. Mr. Gnadt commented that the state may not be able to meet its financial obligations for transit funding but hopefully the federal CARES Act funding will fill in any gaps.

Jay Rank was introduced to the Board as the recently promoted Operations Director. He talked about his career path at MTD and his excitement with the new position.

## B. <u>Champaign County Area Rural Transit System (C-CARTS) Intergovernmental Agreement</u> Update

This agreement continues the relationship between MTD and C-CARTS that has been in place since 2014. Changes to the agreement from the last approval include a new paragraph (Page 9, Item B) listing specific Federal Transit Administration (FTA) requirements, such as civil rights, environmental regulations, and other administrative functions. Since MTD is already required to do them as an FTA grantee, the change does not represent enhanced scrutiny or obligation for the District. Additionally, the Maintenance rates have increased to reflect projected fully allocated rates through June 30, 2022. Mr. Gnadt noted an error in Exhibit A – FY2021 Fully allocated cost per hour should be \$126.06 – not \$26.06.

This agreement was approved by the Champaign County Board at their April 2020 meeting.

MOTION by Mr. Fiscella to authorize the Managing Director to execute the Champaign County Area Rural Transit System Intergovernmental Agreement expiring 6/30/2022 with the change in the FY2021 fully allocated cost per hour in Exhibit A to \$126.06; seconded by Ms. Chaplan.

#### C. Power Feed Options to the Hydrogen Production Station

MTD's hydrogen station requires an electrical connection from the Ameren's power pole in the right-of-way on University Avenue to the hydrogen station. If the power line is run overhead, six trees will have to be removed. If the power line is bored underground, it is likely that the trees will survive. Ameren would pay for the overhead power line extension. MTD would be responsible for the underground line cost (estimated at \$50,000) by using 100% federal funding. Staff would like direction from the Board on which option they would prefer.

Mr. Gnadt noted that if the solar array project moves forward, it will also need to have power run through the same area between University Avenue and the hydrogen power station. If underground boring is the decided option, it would be economical to bore the additional conduits for the solar project at the same time as the conduits for the hydrogen

1		station. Mr. Diel remarked that once the power line goes overhead, MTD will not be able
2		to plant any trees in that area again. From the street, those trees would offer some
3		beneficial screening of the hydrogen plant. Staff would ask for an additional of \$10,000
4		for adding the solar array conduits in the boring cost.

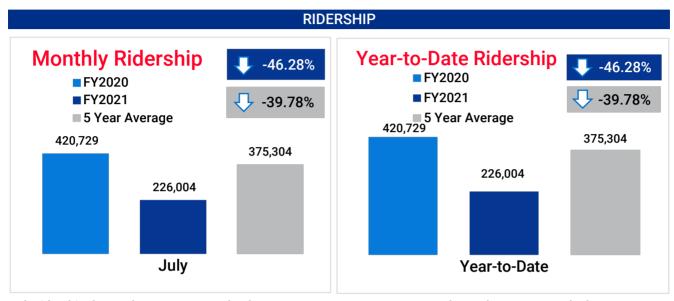

## MTD MANAGING DIRECTOR OPERATING NOTES August, 2020

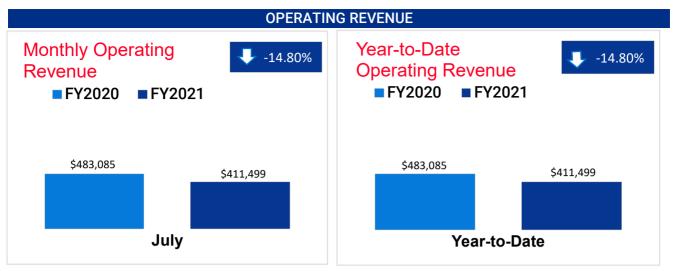


July ridership dropped 46.3% compared to last year at 226,004 versus 420,729 last July. On June 26th, the Restore Illinois plan moved into Phase 4, opening restaurants and bars. The gradual loosening of restrictions may have contributed to more movement around the cities than in previous months. We are <u>slowly</u> recovering ridership.

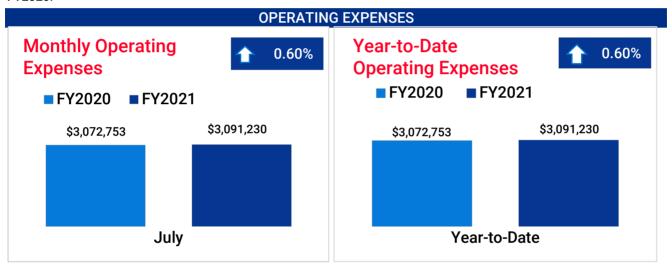
As a reminder, fare-type reporting should be treated with caution, as MTD buses are following a fare-free rear-door boarding policy. As a result, there have been large reductions in boardings with annual and monthly passes.

MTD ADA trips were down 18% at 1,579. DSC ADA rides were down 94% at 354. And UI ADA had zero trips in July.

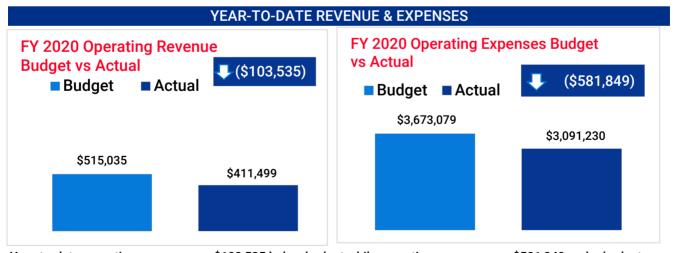
MCORE was in full swing this Summer with construction at Green and Wright and at Wright/Chalmers/Sixth. As a result, no buses are using Wright Street at the Transit Plaza or between Green and Springfield. Likewise, the MCORE reroute in Urbana had Green Street closed between Race and McCullough. The Green route was also affected by a reroute at Vine and Washington. Needless to say, these reroutes do have an effect on trip making and schedule adherence. For the most part though, this is a good time to have major construction being done so that when the students come back, the streets are closer to being done. Some of these reroutes are scheduled to continue until November.



July, 2020 operating revenue was 14.80% below July, 2019, and year-to-date operating revenue was 14.80% below FY2020.



July operating expenses were 0.60% below July, 2019. Year-to-date operating expenses were 0.60% below FY2020.



Year-to-date operating revenues are \$103,535 below budget while operating expenses are \$581,849 under budget.

### MANAGING DIRECTOR'S NOTES

- \* As a result of ongoing employee shortages due to COVID-19 related absences primarily child care issues we decided to implement a minor reduction to our service levels that began Friday, August 21. This mostly means that rather than service going until 5A, we will be ending at 1A. However, SafeRides will continue to run after 1A. We will also be reducing the 22/220 Illini from 10 minute service to 20 minutes service. With a significant number of UI classes being online, we think that this service will be adequate, but the bottom line is, we won't have enough operators available to operate our normal service level. This does allow for more back-up buses on the street to address overcrowding concerns that may arise when school starts, however. We are messaging this to the public in a heavy fashion.
- \* 2020 40 Under 40: Jane Sullivan, Grants & Governmental Affairs Director. Mass Transit Magazine's "40 Under 40" is an annual recognition noting outstanding young individuals making a difference in the public transit industry. Jane Sullivan began her work with MTD in 2012 as a sustainability intern and was first hired as a Sustainability and Transportation planner before working her way up to her current role of Grants & Governmental Affairs Director. We are very proud of Jane and all of her many accomplishments. The District, and our community, are very fortunate to have her investing in her work the way that she does. Congratulations, Jane!
- \* We temporarily suspended the renewal and processing of new DASH Cards when fare enforcement ceased as a response to COVID-19. The DASH Card is for persons over age 65 or for persons with disabilities and enables unlimited, free access to MTD's fixed-route service. The DASH Card also provides access to the Half Fare Cab Program. When our community began shutting down in mid-March, the two cab companies who participate in the Half Fare Cab Program temporarily ceased operating. One of the two cab companies, Atlas Cab, recently restored their service and community members are anxious to utilize the Half Fare Cab Program again. To that end, MTD is offering a new mail in option, instead of exchanging and processing materials at Illinois Terminal, for individuals to renew or get a new DASH Card. It will certainly take more coordination and time, but Customer Service Teams at both Administration & Operations and Illinois Terminal are up to the task to maintain access for this group of riders.
- \* Losing our Planning Manager, Jay Rank (since he was promoted to Operations Director) has necessitated filling out the planning department. Dan Saphiere, our new Analyst Planner, started this month. Dan attended Macalester College in St. Paul and has a bachelors in Economics and Geography. After college Dan was a planning intern at Metro Transit in Minneapolis, working on their BRT project. He also spent 6 months working in Mazatlán, Mexico as a Transit Planner. We are happy to have Dan join our team in this challenging time.
- \* As a result of the Governor's Executive Order and the Champaign-Urbana Public Health District's Ordinance, beginning August 24, 2020 passengers are now required to wear masks. We are altering our messaging to the public to make it clear that this is now a state and local mandate.

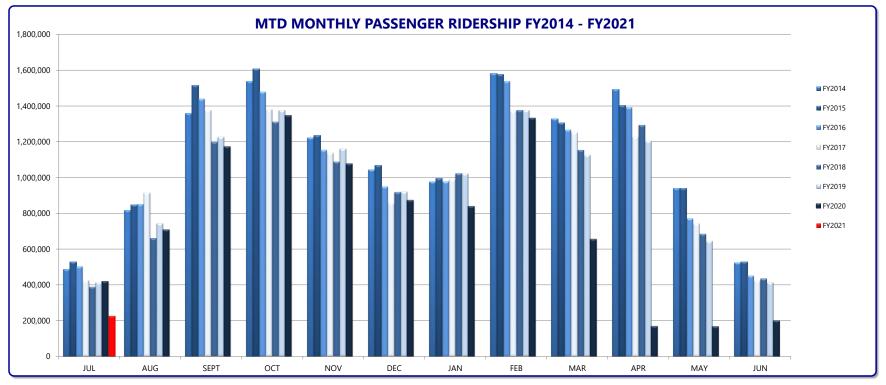

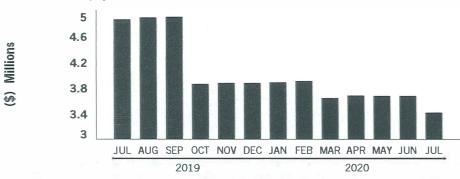

The below chart displays the most recent thirteen months of Market Value.

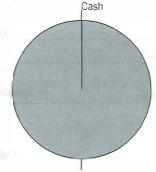

Subject: Approval of Contract for Administration Facility Remodel

- A. Introduction The District seeks to hire a contractor to remodel its Administration Facility.
- **B.** Recommended Action Staff recommends authorization of the Managing Director to execute an agreement with F.H. Paschen, S/N Nielsen & Associates in the amount of \$1,053,000 for the Administration Facility Remodel project.
- C. Background MTD's Administration Facility is beyond capacity. Due to our evolving organizational structure including increases in staff positions, the facility is no longer sufficient for its intended use. MTD currently occupies only half of the facility and has historically leased the other half to a non-transit tenant. The tenant did not renew the lease in 2019 and the tenant space has been vacant since that time. This project will allow MTD to expand its footprint and occupy part of the previous tenant space. Part of the facility will remain available for a future tenant.
- **D. Summary** On August 5, 2020 the District opened bids for the Administration Facility Remodel Project. Nine bids were received (Exhibit A). F.H. Paschen's bid is below the architect's estimate. In general, the project includes:
  - Remodel of front entrance and call center to improve security and functionality
  - Remodel of vacant area (part of former tenant space) to accommodate relocation of Operations
     Department
  - Remodel of Operator's Break Area and Operations Supervisor office to improve functionality
  - Relocation and remodel of Human Resources Department and Customer Service Department to improve functionality
  - Improved meeting rooms, storage areas, and uniform fitting room.
- **E.** Alternatives advantages/disadvantages: Authorizing the Managing Director to enter into a contract with F.H. Paschen allows the District to complete the remodel project. If authorization is not provided, the District would not have adequate space for administration and operations needs.
- F. Budget & Staffing Impacts: This project is funded with 80% federal funds and 20% local funds.
