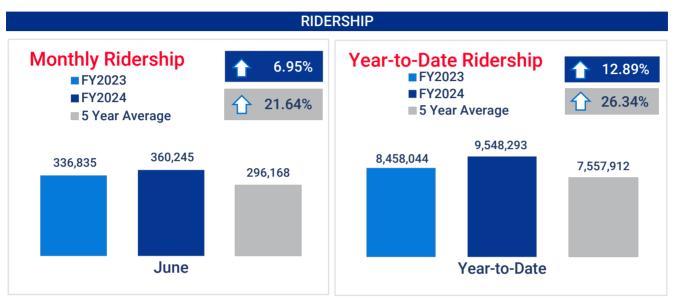

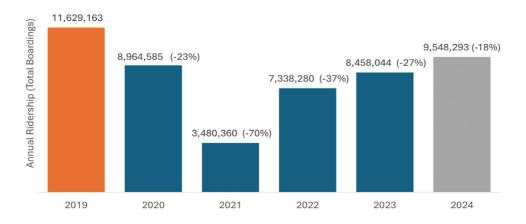
### MTD MANAGING DIRECTOR OPERATING NOTES July 2024



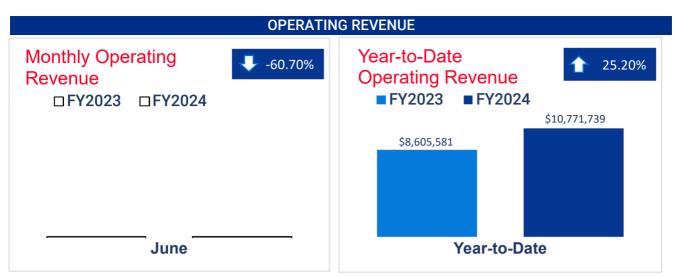
In June 2024, we provided 360,245 rides, which is a 6.9% increase compared to last June. This June had two fewer weekdays, one more Saturday, and one more Sunday, which makes the ridership increase notable.

Comparing fare categories month over month, all of them increased except for the Monthly Pass. The All Day Pass increased by 45.8%, the Veteran Pass increased by 27.5%, and the Annual Pass increased by 22.3%.

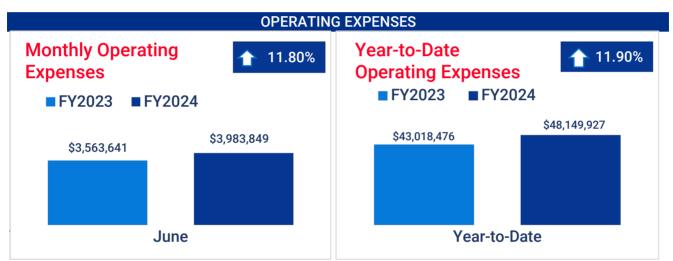
In FY2024, annual ridership increased by 12.9% compared to FY2023 (+1,090,249) for a total of 9,548,293. There was an increase in all fare categories except for U of I Faculty/Staff. The annual All Day Pass ridership increased by 47.4%, SafeRides increased by 35.1%, and Monthly Passes increased by 25.7%.



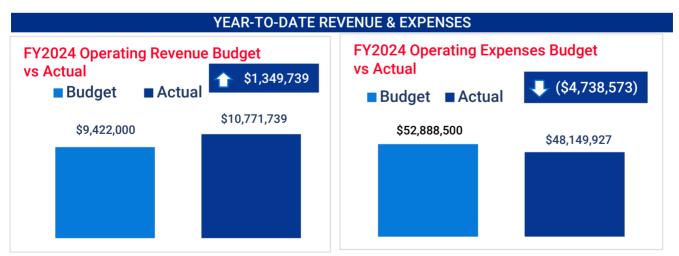
#### Annual Ridership by Fiscal Year



June 2024 operating revenue was 60.70% below June 2023. Year-to-date operating revenue was 25.20% above FY2023.



June 2024 operating expenses was 11.80% above June 2023. Year-to-date operating expenses was 11.90% above FY2023.



Year-to-date operating revenues were \$1,349,739 above budget while operating expenses were \$4,738,573 below budget.

#### MANAGING DIRECTOR'S NOTES

- 1) For the past several years, MTD Operations Supervisors have been trained in de-escalation strategies annually by the former Director of the Police Training Institute at the University of Illinois. Like many strategies taught once a year, the training was sometimes difficult to apply without practice. The Operations Department decided to not only train the Supervisors once a year, but also train the Supervisors to train others. This pushes the Supervisor to become more proficient with the material to be able to share it with others. A new curriculum was designed by Operations Staff. It took portions of the original de-escalation material and combined it with portions of a new Operator de-escalation curriculum, as well as a previously taught mental health curriculum written with help from the Champaign County Mental Health Board. The new curriculum, which will be taught to new Supervisors by current Supervisors will also be taught to Customer Service Information Assistants in June. It is hoped this training will create a greater customer service experience at times when customers become frustrated or disorderly.
- 2) The Hydrogen Fuel Cell Bus Council, a national not-for-profit organization designed to guide policy and provide education on and around hydrogen fuel cell electric buses held two closed-door meetings with the Department of Energy. DOE sought our input on the development and implementation of the \$1 billion "Demand Side Stimulus Mechanism." One meeting was strictly for the Council's private sector members and the other was specifically for transit agencies. The meetings went very well, and we're excited about the prospect of this incentive injecting funds into the hydrogen production sector. As a reminder, I currently serve as the founding President of the Council. Following this page is a letter from the DOE representatives thanking the Council for our input.

Thank you for reaching out to express your support and insights regarding the Regional Clean Hydrogen Hubs (H2Hubs). I am responding on behalf of Secretary Granholm, and I am glad to provide the following information.

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) recognizes that hydrogen fuel cell technology is an important tool in the clean hydrogen economy. DOE aims to achieve a reduction in air pollution through decarbonizing the transportation sector with fuel cell vehicles. As you mentioned in your letter, several H2Hubs plan on leveraging fuel cells for heavy-duty vehicles buses or other mobility applications.

Achieving commercial-scale clean hydrogen deployment is critical to enabling long-term decarbonization objectives while creating good-paying jobs and new economic opportunities in communities across the nation. DOE has awarded an agreement to establish an H2Hubs Demand-Side Initiative to consider a variety of demand-side support mechanisms. 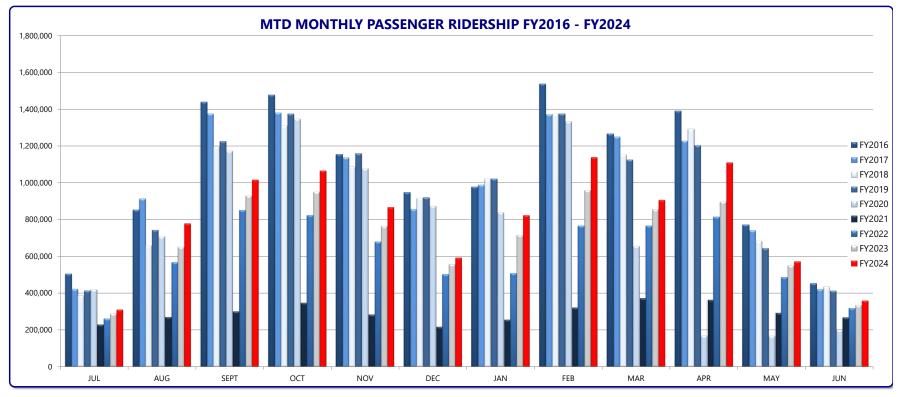

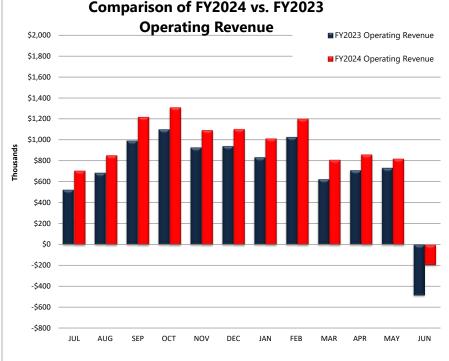

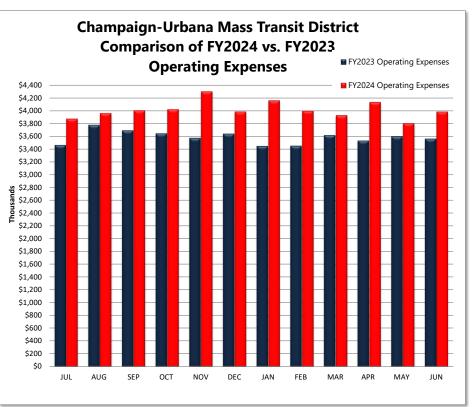

- **A. Introduction:** The Open Meetings Act requires that the minutes of closed sessions be reviewed periodically to determine if the need for confidentiality still exists.
- B. Recommended Action: Suggested motion for the Board's action:
  - i. That the minutes of the closed session meetings of the Board listed on "Schedule 1" marked "Release" no longer require confidential treatment and are ordered released.
  - ii. That the need for confidentiality still exists as to the minutes of the closed session meetings of the Board listed on "Schedule 2" marked "Remain Confidential".
  - iii. That the verbatim recordings of the following listed closed session minutes, "Schedule 3," all of which are not less than 18 months old and the written minutes have been approved are authorized to be destroyed.
- C. Prior Trustee Action: The last semi-annual review by the Board was January 31, 2024.
- D. Background: Closed Sessions allow the MTD Board of Trustees to discuss certain matters of a sensitive nature which affect MTD. Areas that may be discussed in Closed Session are specified in the Illinois Open Meetings Act and include the appointment/employment or dismissal of an employee or officer, land acquisition or sale, and probable or pending litigation involving MTD. When a motion is made to adjourn to a Closed Session, only that specific topic can be discussed, and no final action may be taken on it during the Closed Session. After the Board has determined that it is no longer necessary to protect the public's interest or the privacy of an individual, minutes of the Closed Session are made available to the public.
- **E. Summary**: Schedule 1 lists all closed session minutes by date that are recommended to be released. Schedule 2 lists those minutes that should remain confidential mostly due to privacy concerns from past workers' compensation cases involving current MTD employees.
  - i. The statutes permit the destruction of verbatim recordings of closed sessions if they are not less than 18 months old and the written minutes have been approved. Schedule 3 is a list of those closed meetings that meet that criteria and should be destroyed.
  - ii. All of the unreleased minutes are available for your inspection in the Executive Assistant's office.

#### SUGGESTED MOTION

The Board of Trustees hereby determines as follows:

- A. That the minutes of the closed session meetings of the Board listed on "Schedule 1" marked "Release" no longer require confidential treatment and are ordered released.
- B. That the need for confidentiality still exists as to the minutes of the closed session meetings of the Board listed on "Schedule 2" marked "Remain Confidential."
- C. That the verbatim recordings of the following listed closed session minutes, "Schedule 3", all of which are not less than 18 months old and the written minutes of which have been approved are authorized to be destroyed.
