26 Mr. Gnadt reviewed statistics for March 2025. March 2025 ridership was up 19.4% from March 2024. Year  
27 to date ridership for March 2025 was up 19.4% compared to March 2024. It was noted ridership levels are at  
28 a healthy recovery level post pandemic and MTD will be close to the 2019 ridership levels at the end of the  
29 fiscal year.

30  
31 Mr. Nudo joined the meeting at 3:05pm.

32  
33 March 2025 operating revenue was 1.6% below March 2024. This is a result of the reduction in current  
34 interest rates. Year to date operating revenue was 0.2% above FY2024. Monthly operating expenses were up  
35 11.5% from FY2024. Last year at this time MTD was at an 80% service level. MTD is now at a 100% service  
36 level resulting in this increase in operating expenses. Year to date operating expenses were up 6.5% from  
37 FY2024. March 2025 operating revenue was \$1,969,340 above budget and operating expenses were  
38 \$2,932,096 below budget.

40 Mr. Gnadt noted he is on the Illinois High Speed Rail Commission (IL HSR). The IL HSR is conducting a  
41 feasibility study to explore options that would connect Chicago to St. Louis using high speed rail.

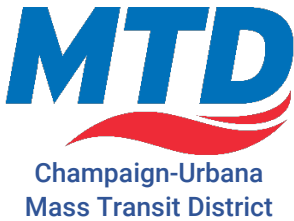

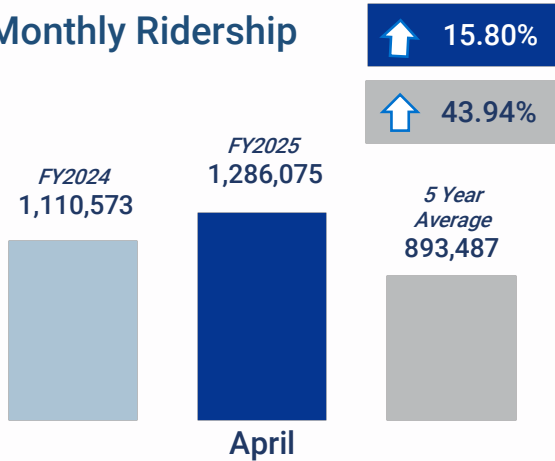

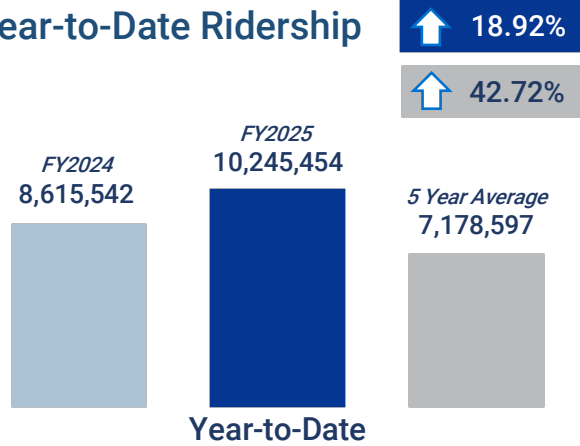

#### Monthly Ridership



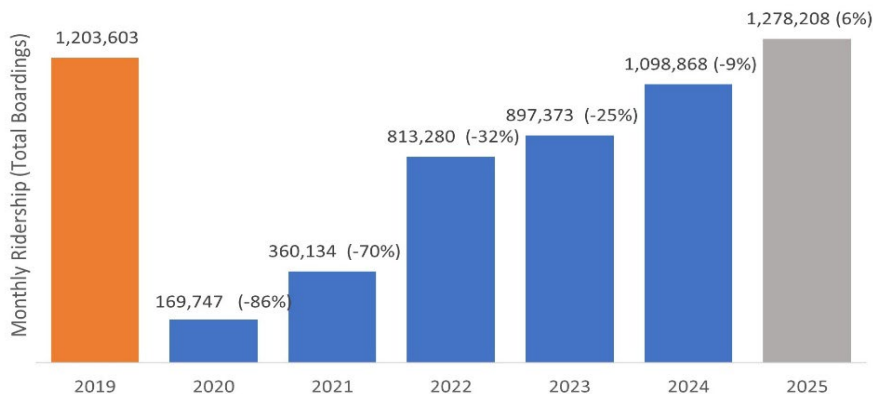
#### Year-to-Date Ridership



April ridership reached 1,286,075, a 15.8% increase compared to last April. For reference, that is also a 6% increase compared to April 2019, which is a pre-pandemic month and had a similar calendar. The FY2025 YTD ridership is 10,245,454, an 18.9% increase over last year. This April had one fewer Sunday due to the Easter Holiday, which was a UI Sunday, while the rest of the day types remained the same as last year.

U of I Student Rides increased the most, up 20%, reaching one million rides. Annual Pass ridership increased by 11.2%, and West Connect increased by 45.2%. This month saw general ridership increases across weekday routes. The 14 Navy and 16 Pink routes doubled their ridership. The 10 Gold Hopper increased by 71.1% likely due to the service restoration efforts. Most day types saw ridership increases, except Sundays, which again can be attributed to Easter.

#### April Ridership by Year

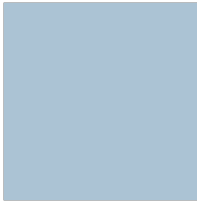

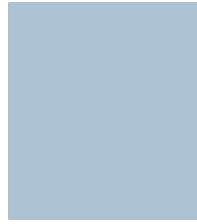

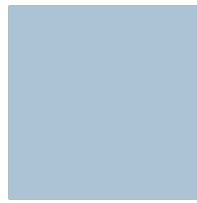

Year-to-date operating revenues were \$2,009,070 above budget while operating expenses were \$3,270,854 below budget.

## MANAGING DIRECTOR'S NOTES

- 1) After waiting for several years for new C-CARTS vans, three vans were picked up in April. The timing was good because several of the oldest vans have 200-300K miles on them, three of those had been taken out of service, and two would need some major repairs to continue operation, which would have cost between \$6-11K. Additionally, we have had many smaller repairs along the way with regular preventative maintenance that were all needed in order to keep the vans available. Keeping the minimum number of vans available for pull out has gotten difficult in the last few weeks, but we are in a much-improved state now.

Maintenance did a great job prioritizing the commissioning of the three new vans to get them in service ASAP. They were available for use on Friday, April 25 when they were scheduled to be ready mid-May. This was fortuitous as that same day, a few vans had air conditioning issues. While we can run a van without air conditioning, it is not ideal.

The even better news is that we are expecting an additional four soon. They are awaiting inspection at the dealership before they will be released. Once we have the vans on property, it takes a few weeks to get them ready to go in service, including radios, cameras, and vinyl installation.

And while there will still be some vehicles that have high mileage after we get these seven vans in service, the C-CARTS fleet will be much more manageable and have increased flexibility.

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- 2) Human Resources kicked off open enrollment last week, which includes major changes to nearly all benefit offerings. Health, dental, vision, and voluntary benefit carriers all changed, in part due to Health Alliance's exit from the marketplace. To support employees through the transition, HR launched a comprehensive communication and support plan.

Informational group sessions—held both in person and online—ran daily from May 12–16 and featured representatives from Blue Cross Blue Shield (our new major medical provider) and Gallagher (MTD's insurance broker). One-on-one “camp-out” sessions are available across all locations from May 19–30, giving employees the opportunity to meet individually with HR for enrollment assistance. Additional resources, including our 5th Annual Benefits Fair and sessions on retirement planning, Medicare, and fraud prevention, were also scheduled to ensure all employees have access to the guidance they need.

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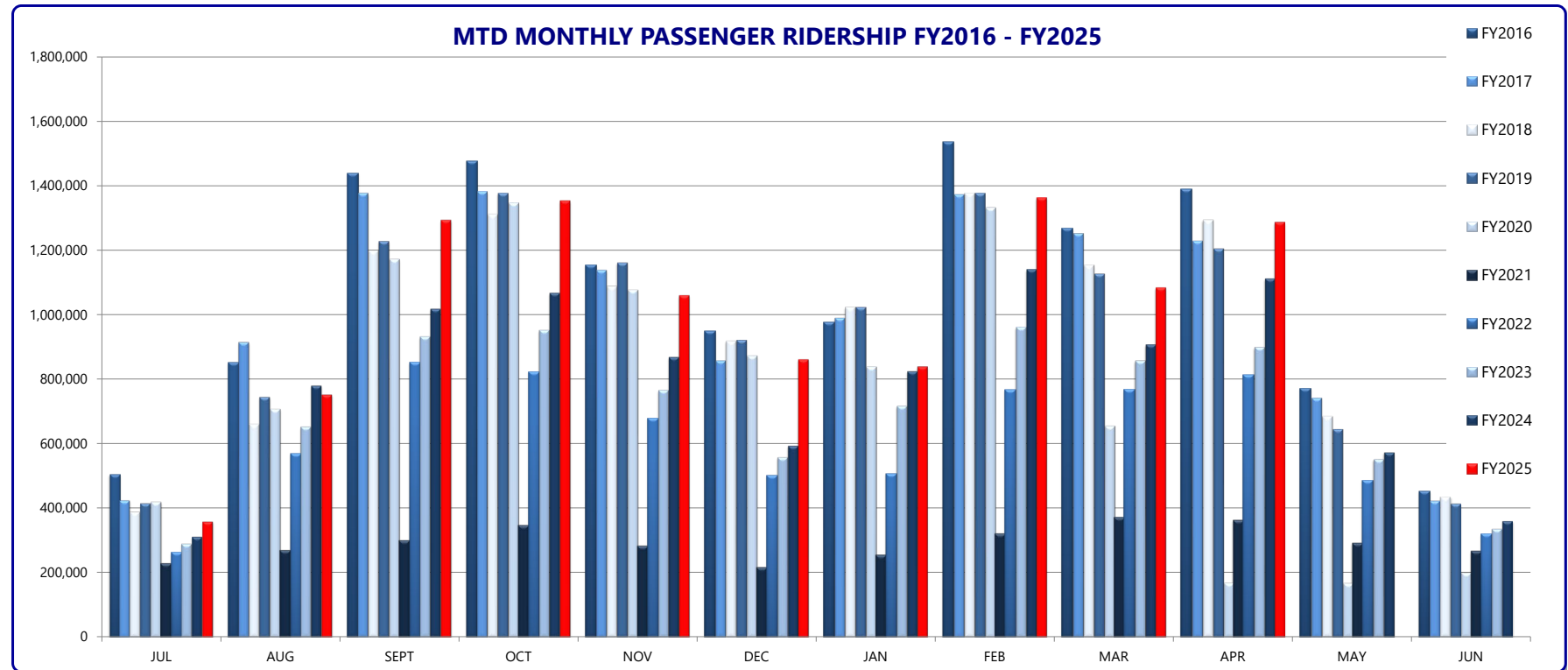

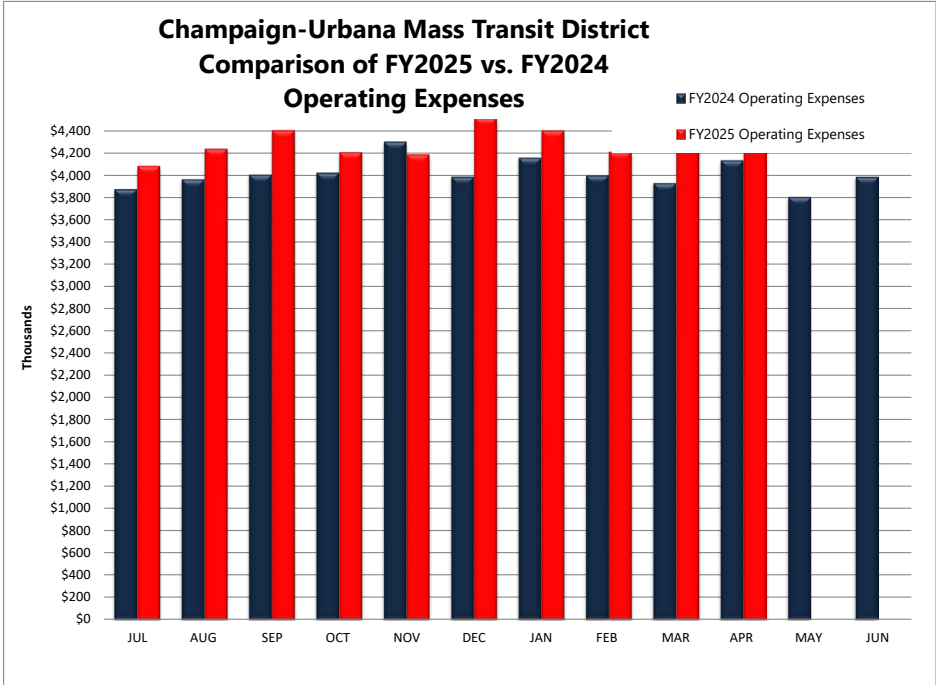
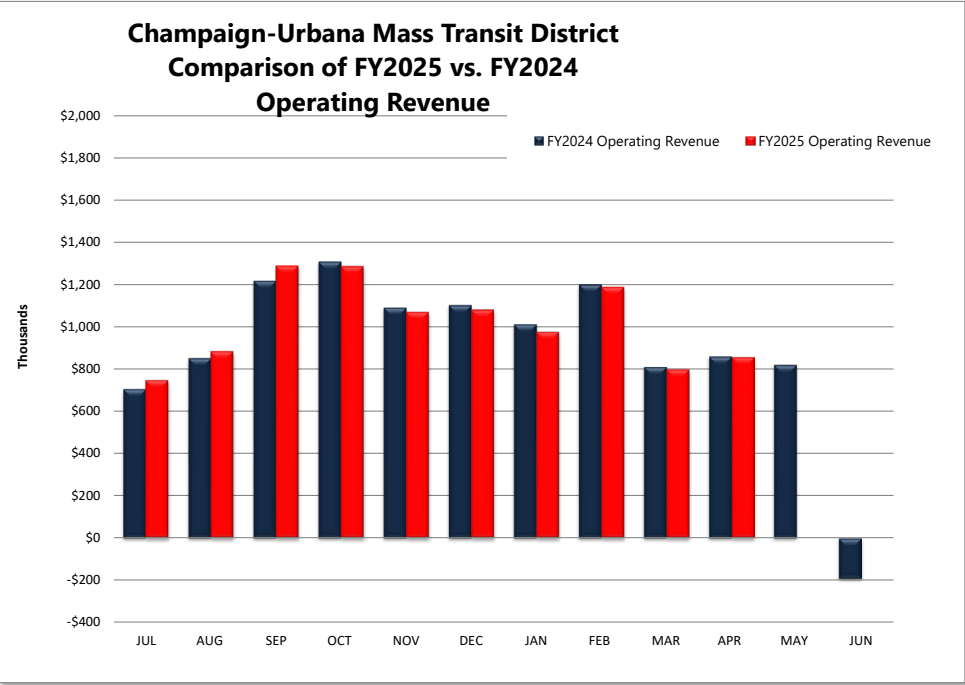

### **BUDGET SYNOPSIS FOR FY2026**

A few data points impacting the budget proposal:

- 1) Absence trends are causing need for over-hiring.
- 2) Diesel and gasoline prices continue to fluctuate.
- 3) Medical insurance premiums will be increasing up to approximately 18%.
- 4) Health Alliance shutdown causing much additional uncertainty.
- 5) Worker's Compensation Insurance rate increase of 30%.
- 6) Excess liability insurance is expected to increase 10 - 15% nationally again.
- 7) Utility rates and delivery charges have continued to increase.
- 8) Current fareboxes are no longer supported, so replacement plan being implemented.
- 9) Several large capital projects are reflected in budget, but will not have expenses in FY2026. They are reflected for contracting and grant management purposes.
  - For example: the H2 Production Station Expansion project is listed twice due to unknown status of funding source options.

Wages are adjusted 3.5%. This will be the third year of the three-year employee wage understanding.

Labor and Fringe Costs are approximately 75% of our total operating costs.

The IMRF employer contribution rate for CY2025 is 8.64%.

- CY2026 rate is unknown at this time.

Diesel fuel costs were calculated at \$4.25.

Assumes a tax levy increase of 5.0% to capture all new EAV and newly annexed areas.
